

\$20,000 DAMAGE SUITS NEAR END IN COURT HERE

The \$20,000 damage suits of Mrs. Allan Glass against Shichitaro Fujii were expected to reach the jury in United States district court late this afternoon.

Counsel began their arguments to the jury this morning after Judge James Alger Fee had denied defense motions for directed verdicts in favor of the defendant.

Mrs. Glass seeks \$10,000 as administratrix of the estate of her husband, Clayburn Glass, who was fatally injured in a collision between the Glass and Fujii cars on the Pacific highway north of Medford last December 22. She is also suing for \$10,000 for alleged personal injuries to herself.

Fujii stated he rendered aid to Mr. and Mrs. Glass after the crash. Later at Medford Community hospital, he declared Mrs. Glass said to him that she did not blame "you boys for the accident," reference being made to a youthful hitch-hiker Fujii said he had picked up in Shasta, Calif. He stated he had since been unable to find the hitch-hiker.

In rebuttal, Mrs. Glass denied ever having made the statement to Fujii. Fujii said he was 37, Seattle resident and exporter of lumber to Japan and China. He said he was married to an American-born wife and had two American-born children.

Dr. Edwin R. Durno testified he had made an examination of Mrs. Glass on September 29 or 30. As far as he could determine, he asserted, she was normal physically. He said he found her thyroid gland was symmetrically enlarged and that a hyper-active thyroid might possibly result from emotional shock after an accident. Physical injuries would not affect the gland, he stated.

PLMBERS REQUIRED TO HOLD CARD FROM STATE HEALTH BOARD

"The state law requires any person representing themselves as journeymen plumbers in Oregon to hold a certificate of competency from the state board of health," it was stated today by Arthur J. Farrell, plumbing inspector of the Oregon State Board of Health, who is in Medford.

He stated that the public certificate when plumbing work was done. He said that if such were done, it would help the state in weeding out those without cards, and insure the public receiving work from genuine journeymen plumbers.

Mr. Farrell also pointed out that it was a misdemeanor under the state law for a master plumber to employ anyone not holding a journeyman certificate and send them out on a job. It is the state's policy to prosecute offenders when the violation is discovered, he stated.
