

### B. P. W. CLUBS OF SOUTHERN OREGON WILL MEET HERE

District Conference Slated Next Saturday and Sunday — Jamboree Slated Saturday Evening at Hotel

The Southern Oregon District Conference of Oregon Federation of Business and Professional Women's clubs will be held in Medford, October 16 and 17. Clubs included in this district are Bend, Grants Pass, Klamath Falls and Medford. A large number of state officers and delegates from other sections of the state will also attend. Mrs. Maud Snider, president of the Medford club and chairman of the conference, announces that the program will open Saturday evening with a jamboree at the Medford hotel, with Miss Viola Scherrer in charge, as slated by 12 Medford members. Miss Scherrer promises a full evening's entertainment with music and special numbers in addition to the fun program. Grants Pass B. P. W. club plans to furnish two numbers of the program.

Mrs. Zola Morgan of Hillsboro, state president, will preside at the executive council breakfast at 7:15 a. m. The official program of the conference will be presented at the Elks Temple Sunday from 10 a. m. to 12:30 p. m., with Mrs. Mabel G. Mack, state program chairman, in charge. Mrs. Mack has arranged a varied program for this session which will aid local club program chairmen in program work. Mrs. Morgan will give a report of the biennial convention of the National Federation of Business and Professional Women's clubs, held at Atlantic City in July.

Miss Constance Loftis, of Hood River, state membership chairman, will discuss "How to Gain and Hold Members."

Miss Ann Hindle of Portland, state publicity chairman, will discuss "The Value of Publicity and What is Adequate Publicity."

Miss Ruth Moore, state public relations chairman, will present a discussion of "What Controls Business and Trade and Labor Organizations," which is one phase of the program of the national federation on "Our Town's Business." Assisting Miss Moore on this program will be Hilda Lammer of Bend, Thora Lawrence of Medford, and Irene Ringuette of Grants Pass.

The conference will close with a luncheon at the Medford hotel, at which Mrs. Snider will preside. The program includes introduction of state officers by Mrs. Morgan, and one-minute talks by all local club presidents in attendance.

Miss Evangeline Philbin of Portland, state chairman of international relations, luncheon speaker, will discuss the Pan-American Peace conference which she attended in Vancouver, B. C., as a delegate of the National Federation of Business and Professional Women's clubs. Miss Philbin is a very able speaker, and she will have a message of interest to everyone.

All club members of the southern Oregon district are urged to attend all sessions of the conference with exception of the executive council breakfast which is open only to state officers and club presidents.

The Klamath Falls trophy cup will be awarded to the club traveling the largest number of miles per members attending. The Portland club has stated that they will be contenders for the cup. The Hillsboro club is also planning to bring a large delegation. The cup was won by Portland at the September conference. Local musicians will assist in the Sunday program. Mrs. Marjorie Pena, Girl Scout executive, will lead singing at the morning program. Mrs. Mabel Sims will be the accompanist. Mrs. Effie Erbert Kurtz will lead singing at the noon luncheon.

### MARTIN TO RECEIVE TOWNSEND PETITION


SALEM, Oct. 14. — (AP) — Petitions signed by more than 100,000 Townsends, asking for a special legislative session to amend the old age assistance law in Oregon, will be presented to Governor Charles H. Martin at a mass meeting here tonight. Governor Martin said he had accepted an invitation to attend the meeting and will give an address. The Townsends are urging that the minimum pension for persons eligible for old age assistance be fixed at \$30 a month. The present law places the maximum pension at \$30 a month.

### 6 P. M. CLOSING NOT SOUGHT IN PORTLAND

PORTLAND, Oct. 4. — (AP) — The Portland Grocery Clerks' union has no contracts providing for 6 p. m. closing, nor does it advocate thus shortening store operations. Tom B. Lenhart, president, said today.

He attributed reported statements to the contrary to "certain unscrupulous employers" who wished to establish 6 p. m. closing in order to reduce salary expense.

Local stores at present are operating 112 hours a week, with 11 p. m. the latest permitted closing hour, he said, with the operating week to be shortened to 98 hours when Sunday closing becomes effective November 1.
