

DOG HERO SHOWED PROMISE AS PUP SAYS EX-OWNER

"Bob," a five-year-old black Australian female shepherd belonging to Mrs. F. E. Troutler of 518 East Main street, is undoubtedly a proud mother these days. For it was one of her puppies—Snap—who 10 days ago gave up its life that little Shirley Mansfield, two and one-half years old, might be saved from the fire that destroyed the A. R. Mansfield home near Butte Falls.

Given the masculine name by her owner because of the short tail "Bob" wagged, the black shepherd had a litter of seven puppies April 12, 1937, and "Snap" was one of them. Mrs. Troutler named the little fellow "Stub," because from its mother it inherited a tail. Most all the seven were black, like their mother. "Stub," or "Snap," as it later named by the Mansfields, was later when six weeks old, and its noble life ended when it entered the flaming house to draw the baby's crib close to the window so that the parents might reach in and draw the child to safety.

"Stub" was so cute without a tail," Mrs. Troutler said today. "Like a little cub bear. We were terribly fond of him."

Mrs. Troutler said that "Bob" was expecting another litter about October 29. She also stated that all seven of the litter which included "Snap" had been sold and that she had received wonderful reports of them. At seven weeks old, she said, three of the little fellows caught and killed a huge rat in her garage. The rat was almost as large as the puppies, she said.

NEW YORK, Oct. 15.—(AP)—Dips and rallies, each fast enough to put the ticker tape several minutes behind, alternated with bewildering frequency in today's stock market.

The list fell at the opening, but quickly rebounded under leadership of U. S. Steel and others in this group. Rapid buying soon spread to virtually all sections except the motors. Weakness of Chrysler, off 5 points at the worst, then chilled the recovery swing and net gains running to 3 or more points were cut down substantially in later dealings.

While steel held sizable portions of their advance, many former favorites failed to join the move and trends were highly mixed at the close. New lows for the past 2 years or longer were plentiful.

Trading slowed in the final period. Transfers were around 2,500,000 shares. Today's closing prices for 32 selected stocks follow:
