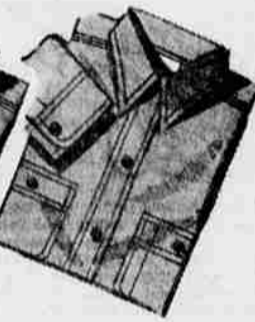

Fifty-one men have been enlisted in the United States navy as the recruiting district for the Portland re-district. It was announced today by Ernest M. West, recruiter in charge of the sub-station in the Medford federal building.

Registration of returning alumni will begin Friday noon and will conclude at noon the following day, with a cup offered to the fraternity or sorority registering the greatest number of returning "grads."

Kelfert of Merrill and Fred M. Cavin of Hornbrook, Cal. The men passed their final qualifying examinations in Portland October 15, and are now at the naval training station in San Diego, Cal.
