PLEA FOR PEACE VOICED BY HULL ON CANADA VISIT

Summons "Outraged Conscience of Mankind" To Set In Motion Forces To Restore World Peace.

TORONTO, Canada, Oct. 22.—(AP)—Cordell Hull, America's secretary of state, summoned the "outraged conscience of mankind" today to set in motion forces designed to restore world peace.

"There is a grim paradox," he asserted, "in the trends which are so clearly discernible today. As civilization moves to higher and higher levels, as the march of progress opens wider and wider horizons of material and cultural advancement, war becomes more relentlessly cruel, more thorough and effective in its unrestrained savagery."

MAINLINER SERVICE DEPENDS ON BETTER PORTLAND AIRPORT

SEATTLE, Oct. 22.—(AP)—Continuance of Douglas Mainliner service to Portland and Seattle by the United Airlines depends upon whether Portland can provide proper landing facilities at its new airport near Columbia slough, A. Hainer Hinshaw, company executive said today.

Falling this, he said, the United Airlines will serve the territory north of Oakland after November 1 with smaller, Boeing planes, which do not require runways as long as those needed by the 21-passenger Mainliners.

Landing facilities at Swan Island airport at Portland, he indicated, are inadequate for the large ships under federal regulations for winter flying. "Furthermore," Hinshaw's statement said, "if Portland provides such accessories" United Airlines will immediately institute through sleeper service from Seattle to Portland and New York.

LUMBERMAN SUCCEEDS IN SCISSORS SUICIDE

SN DIEGO, Cal., Oct. 22.—(AP)—Frank Stebinger, 55, vice-president of the Inman-Poulson Lumber company of Portland, Ore., died in a local hospital last night of stab wounds in the chest, said by Deputy Coroner Dave Gerahan to have been self-inflicted.

Hull reiterated previous pleas for complete and general respect for international agreements as an indispensable condition to achievement of international order. "There must be a firmly established sense of mutual respect and international agreements as an indispensable condition to achievement of international order."

—without the exaction of victory or the infliction of humiliation." Hull warned that no nation can escape the repercussions of a major armed conflict anywhere in the modern world.

"However far they may be removed from the seat of actual fighting, all nations feel their morale weakened by the horror of war and their well-being impaired by the processes of disruption and ruin which spread in ever-widening circles from the territories being laid waste by war. Once the engines of war are brought into action in any portion of the earth, there is no security, no confidence, no buoyancy or energy of spirit anywhere."
