WELLS SAYS F.D.R. FACES DIFFICULTIES

WASHINGTON, Oct. 21.—(UP)—President Roosevelt is "quite straight in his effort" without any trace of the dictator and faces terrific difficulties in educating an "extraordinary old-fashioned country," H. G. Wells, British author, said today after a chat at the White House. Mr. Roosevelt's two chief obstacles in his attempt to "organize the country on modern lines in political life," Wells said, are: The constitution, which Wells considers too rigid. The lack of a good civil service.

SWEENEY WILL BE INSTALLED CHIEF OF MEDICAL GROUP

Dr. Charles T. Sweeney, prominent Medford physician and surgeon, will be installed tonight as president of the Oregon State Medical society which is now holding its 63rd annual convention in Salem. He will succeed Dr. Charles E. Sears of Portland. Upon his installation tonight, Dr. Sweeney will have held the highest

honors that can be bestowed by medical organizations in the northwest region which embraces six states and British Columbia. He has been president of the Pacific Northwest Medical association, which engages in scientific research, the Southern Oregon Medical association and the Jackson County Medical society. Dr. Sweeney is the first southern Oregon physician in many years to head the state society. The Oregon State Medical society and the Jackson County Medical society are subsidiaries of the American Medical Association and are consultants for the drafting of legislation pertaining to the health welfare of the public. Dr. and Mrs. Sweeney left here Tuesday morning, going first to Eugene where the doctor addressed the weekly luncheon-meeting of the Rotary club at noon and attended a meeting of the Lane County Medical society in the evening. They continued Wednesday to Salem for the state society sessions, Mrs. Sweeney attending meetings of the auxiliary.
