COAST-TO-COAST RECORD MARKED. Giant transport planes of United Air Lines flying their regular routes along the mid-continent airway to-night will record the 20,000th coast-to-coast passenger plane trip over that route, thereby setting an international record for long distance scheduled passenger plane operations. A single-engine mail plane carrying two passengers completed the first coast-to-coast passenger schedule in 1927 through connections at Chicago of Boeing Air Transport and National Air Transport, later merged into United Air Lines. The 1927 flight required 38 hours and 14 refueling stops. The fare was 15 cents a mile. Progress made in the last decade is indicated by the fact that tonight's anniversary flight from coast to coast will require 15 hours and just three refueling stops, at fares which are only one-third of what they were 10 years ago.

70 VARIETIES OF FRUIT TAKEN OFF ONE TREE. ORLEANS, Ind., Oct. 28.—(AP)—Harvesting one tree in R. A. Troth's orchard turned out to be quite a job. He started the tree as a seedling because he "wanted to see how far a grower could go in grafting."
