Perhaps the biggest, single-handed publicity stunt ever pulled off was that of young Herostrotus of Ephesus, perpetrated in the year 356 B. C. He actually burned to ruins the mighty Temple of Diana, one of the Seven Wonders of the World—in order to make famous his name. The deed resulted in his name being condemned to oblivion during his life time—but emblazoned it in history as the world's most sensational "fire bug."
Put under torture, Herostrotus confessed the reason that motivated his arson. To make certain his ends were not achieved, the Ephesians passed a law forbidding the mention of his name under penalty of death.
