

Ronald Colman In "Prisoner Of Zenda" Opening At Craterian Today

MADELEINE CARROLL, DOUGLAS FAIRBANKS JR. IN FAMOUS SHOW

Ronald Colman, fresh from his triumphs in "Lost Horizon," turns to an entirely different characterization in "The Prisoner of Zenda," opening a three-day showing today at the New Craterian theater.

As the daring adventurer in this famous story by Anthony Hope, Colman portrays a dual role—that of Rudolph Rassendyll, gentleman, army officer, imbued with a zest for danger—and that of King Rudolph, carefree, light-hearted, without too much regard for his obligations. When the two meet on the eve of the king's coronation, and together have a fling before the king renounces his style of riotous living upon taking over the throne, Rassendyll first begins to learn of the strange part he is to play in the history of the kingdom.

Following the party it is discovered that the king has been plied with doped wine and is in no condition to take part in the coronation. It is then that Rassendyll's likeness to the king is noticed and he is prevailed upon to portray the role of his distant cousin. Later, when the real king, during the other's absence, is kidnapped and held prisoner in the castle at Zenda, the real adventure begins and does not terminate until after a series of high adventures, duels, political intrigue and romance has been brought into the action.

The role of Princess Faltva, who prepared to give herself to a king she does not love, finds herself enamored by the imitator, is Madeleine Carroll, admittedly the most beautiful actress on the screen. As Rupert of Hentzau, whose reckless daring is matched only by his dashing attraction for the ladies, is Douglas Fairbanks, Jr., was chosen. Others in the cast include Mary Astor as Antoinette de Mauban, C. Aubrey Smith as Colonel Zapt, Raymond Massey as the treacherous Black Michael, and David Niven as Fritz von Tarlenheim.

Marlene Dietrich In Romantic Film On Rialto Screen

Marlene Dietrich and Robert Donat, one of the most glamorous romantic teams in screen history, are at the Rialto theatre today and tomorrow only in "Knight Without Armor," one of the most important pictures of the year.

Fittingly enough, their vehicle is one of the few great love stories of all time, from the pen of the famous James Hilton, who wrote "Lost Horizon" and "Good-bye Mr. Chips."

"Knight Without Armor" casts the exotic Marlene as an alluring Russian countess, and Donat is seen as a mysterious modern knight errant whose hatred flares into a flame of protective love as they live through a series of stirring adventures, knowing moments of incomparable horror and bliss as they flee from the countless terrors that threaten to tear them apart.

The settings for the film are among the most impressive ever seen on the screen, these including a forest so real that it fooled hundreds of birds and bullfrogs who moved in for the winter, and a section of railway complete with two genuine locomotives.
