CROP CONTROL PASSAGE HELD UNLIKELY COMPROMISE SEEN ON WAGES' HOURS CONSIDER CHANCES GOOD FOR 7 MODIFIED TVAS APPROVE 6 PRESIDENTIAL ADVISERS IS EXPECTED

WASHINGTON, Nov. 11.—If you should be interested in a quick survey of the coming special session of congress, as the old gray squirrel sees it from the top of the White House elm, here it is: Crop Control.—No crop control—too many men, too many minds. Wages and Hours: Every effort to jam the bill through the house, as is, repair such senatorial sabotage as may have been committed, and rewrite otherwise, as near administration desires as possible, in conference. Seven Sisters: TVA has a good chance to get through five or more "planning boards," perhaps two as little TVAs. Government Reorganization: Six White House advisers expected to be readied up for delivery at 1600 Pennsylvania avenue. Other points not too hopefully expected.

There have been some deep and subterranean thunders in northwest Washington that haven't reached the surface yet. When they do get above ground, they may shake the solid walls of the department of the interior. However, the building is said to be earthquake-proof. The cause of the disturbance is the coming re-entrance of Colonel Henry Waite into the Washington scene. Mr. Waite will make a thorough investigation and survey of the public works administration, and do it on presidential request. Not that any scandal is involved or even suspected. The administration merely wants the facts when congress, at the next regular session, looks upon PWA and asks: How does she stand? But the rumbling, or at least the grumbling, comes from the fact that it was Mr. Waite, who, as deputy administrator of the PWA (old style) couldn't get along with Secretary Ickes at all. Secretary Ickes can, on the other hand, get along very well without Mr. Waite, especially as supervisor of Mr. Ickes and all his works. There are some Republicans who attach much significance to the victory of Senator Moore in the New Jersey governorship race. Though a Democrat, he is said to lean to the right. The same people feel that the predominance of Republicans in the vote for delegates to the constitutional convention in New York is a swing away from the New Deal. But some folks are worrying about a splitting of legal hairs which they say might rob them of a part of their New Jersey victory. Some, it is said, even sought the department of justice to give them a ruling on the matter. This is the problem. Must Senator Moore resign from the senate before he can take the oath of office as governor? If he must, between the time he resigns

PICKETS REMOVED FROM FREIGHTER AT LAST MOMENT

Union Action Releases 11 Carloads of Lumber — Suspension Not Automatically Off, Say Employers

PORTLAND, Nov. 11.—(AP)—The C.I.O. sawmill workers withdrew a picket line from the freighter Hegira today at the moment a waterfront employers' association order suspended port activities because of labor trouble. The union action released 11 carloads of lumber. Loading operations began immediately. "We decided to release the lumber rather than throw the west coast longshoremen out of work," said George Brown, president of the sawmill organization. Loading the Hegira does not automatically remove the suspension," reported Edward S. Coates, manager of the employers' association. "We put it up to the longshoremen and they have taken this action. We want assurance that similar incidents will not occur." Coates said employer representatives would meet with longshore officials "to try and get the whole thing cleaned up in the northwest." Longshoremen refused to pass pickets at lines Monday when C.I.O. millworkers asserted a legitimate strike existed at the Carnation Lumber company at Forest Grove, operated by A.P.L. workers and alleged source of the hot cargo. The employers said the stevedores had violated their working agreement. The conference today will also consider a dispute which has closed the Coos Bay port at Marshfield for four days. C.I.O. dock workers declined to handle lumber from a mill manned by A.P.L. employees. Six freighters moved to down river ports late yesterday to avoid a possible indefinite tieup. Shipping concerns employed all available longshoremen to get cargo aboard.

FIRST SNOW FOR KLAMATH REGION KLAMATH FALLS, Nov. 11.—(AP)—The first snowstorm of the winter ushered Armistice Day into Klamath county, covering the basin region with a two-inch blanket and generally blocking mountain roads. Main highways remained open, although plows had to be called out to clear six inches of snow from Sun mountain pass on the route north to Bend. Heavy snow was also reported on the Quartz mountain sector of the Lakeview highway and on the Greensprings route to Ashland. The east entrance to Crater Lake was closed, and travel was impossible over the Diamond lake road.

GEN. JOHNSON BARRED FROM RADIO HOOK-UP

NEW YORK, Nov. 11.—(UP)—Gen. Hugh S. Johnson, radio commentator and former head of the N.R.A., was not permitted to broadcast last night by the National Broadcasting company because his subject was social diseases, a spokesman for the general's commercial sponsor said.

Duke Shuns Church Rites Despite Vicar's Apology

PARIS, Nov. 11.—(AP)—An Anglican pastor apologized today to the Duke of Windsor for an "insult" to a "man who couldn't defend himself," but the duke, nevertheless, shunned an Armistice day service within St. George's church here because his presence previously had been declared unwelcome. The pastor, the Rev. J. L. C. Dart, explaining his expressed wish that the former British king and former head of the Church of England not attend the service told the British Legion: "The very last thing I wished to do was publicly to insult a man who couldn't defend himself." Reporters made me do that. Nothing was further from my intentions. I swear that is true. I wish to take this opportunity publicly to apologize." The vicar allegedly had apologized to the duke's equerry, Lieut. Dudley Forwood, an hour before the service and said he wanted to apologize to Windsor for "what amounted to a public insult."

LUNATIC CREATES JAPANESE SPREAD SCENE WHEN KING FIRE, DEATH, RUIN HONORS WAR DEAD IN NANTAO AREA

LONDON, Nov. 11.—(AP)—An escaped asylum inmate broke through the king's guards today, and with the cry "Hypocrites!" shattered the two minutes of silent Armistice day tribute to Britain's war dead. King George, standing rigidly at attention during the solemn service before the World War cenotaph, ignored the disturber who shouted: "All this is hypocrisy—you're deliberately preparing for war!" Queen Mother Mary and Queen Elizabeth, watching from a home office window, looked on aghast. Hand uplifted, unarmed and clad in a raincoat, the middle-aged man dashed through the line of sailor guards a few feet to the right and to the rear of the monarch. Shouting, he appeared to trip. Guards scuffled him quickly to the pavement, and hands clasped over his mouth drowned out further outcry during the period of silence. Apparently unconscious, he was carried quickly out of the crowd and taken to Saint Stephen's hospital at Fulham for medical observation. He was identified as Stanley Storey, who escaped September 21 from the Cape Mill asylum in Surrey. The incident recalled a similar disorder at a great state occasion when Edward, now Duke of Windsor, was king before his brother. Edward had been on the throne only six months when on July 15, 1936, a journalist, George Andrew Mahon, alighted a pistol across the pavement in the king's direction as he rode down Constitution hill to Buckingham palace after presenting colors to guards regiments at a huge review in Hyde park. Mahon subsequently was sentenced to one year at hard labor.

ENJOIN DESTRUCTION SEIZED COIN DEVICES

PORTLAND, Nov. 11.—(UP)—The circuit court here late Wednesday granted a temporary injunction to slot machine owners, enjoining officials from destroying or damaging their confiscated machines. Commissioner J. E. Bennett, Chief of Police Harry M. Niles and City Attorney Frank Grant, named as defendants, were ordered to appear in court next Monday to show cause why the injunction should not become permanent. The plaintiffs, estimated the value of the machines at \$2,500, declared they had stored the machines exclusively for sale outside the city and state to purchasers lawfully entitled to operate them.

BARBER USES AX ON MOTHER-IN-LAWS HEAD

FORT DODGE Ia., Nov. 11.—(UP)—An attorney and an officer answering a request of a 43-year-old barber to come to his home last night found Mrs. Elizabeth Krutchen, 63, lying in a pool of blood in the basement. Nearby was an axe. Mrs. Krutchen is Eric's mother-in-law, police said. She suffered a deep skull wound and her condition was critical. Police said the barber, Louis J. Eric, told them he struck the woman with the axe. They said Eric and his wife had been having domestic trouble, and that he blamed Mrs. Krutchen for difficulties in his home.
