Special Meeting—Women's auxiliary of the Disabled American Veterans of the World War will hold a special meeting next Wednesday evening in the home of Mrs. Harvey Casman, to make plans for winter activities, it was announced today.

Move to Klamath—Hugh Ritter, district ranger of the Rogue River national forest at Lake of the Woods, and Mrs. Ritter were to move today to Klamath Falls where Mr. Ritter will be stationed during the winter. His office will be in the postoffice building.

Bears Bagged—Reports arriving from outlying areas indicate that bear hunting is producing more results this season than in recent years. Another big bruin was bagged in the Lake of the Woods region a few days ago by Elmer Rowden, Rogue River national forest guard. The forest service also said that a hunter whose name was not procured, recently shot two bears in the Fort Klamath area. The hunter was assisted in tracking the animals by 11 hounds, forest service headquarters stated.

Residence Fire—Slight damage was done by fire late yesterday afternoon in the residence of Mrs. C. Horner at 618 North Front street. The wall and ceiling of the living room were scorched. Insulation of electric wires in the attic were burned and there was some water damage. Chief Roy Elliott reported. The fire started where a stovepipe from a wood heater entered a chimney, the chief said. The fire department answered a ward alarm at 4:35 p. m.

Postmasters Meet—Reports on the national convention of postmasters held recently in San Francisco were presented at a regular monthly meeting of the Jackson County Postmasters' association in the Medford postoffice last night. The reports were given by C. H. Maasie, Grants Pass postmaster and guest speaker, W. H. Fuller, Ashland postmaster, and Mrs. Gladys M. Heath, Rogue River postmistress. Frank DeSouza, Medford postmaster and county president, presided.

Back from Alaska—Privates Elza and Ellsworth Ring, sons of Mrs. Bessie L. Ring of Gold Hill, have returned to the United States after an absence of two years on a tour of foreign service with the 7th Infantry, U. S. A., at Chilkoot Barracks, Alaska. They have been granted a 90-day furlough to spend at home and with friends in Gold Hill and Medford. Upon their return to Vancouver Barracks, Wash., the Ring brothers will be assigned to company K, 7th Infantry, according to announcement from army recruiting headquarters in Portland. The boys enlisted in the army on August 5, 1935. They were assigned to Chilkoot Barracks at their own request.

Noisy Geese—Another band of geese awakened a large part of the Medford population as they honked overhead during the night. Disturbed by the northwest storm, the birds were making a night flight south and tarried over town when they were attracted by the city lights. It was explained by H. C. Oby, assistant superior and game expert of the Rogue River national forest. It had been some years since a band of migratory birds had hovered over the city. Last Friday a band of ducks circled around the city for a large part of the night. A couple of weeks ago a band of geese settled down for the night at the South Park COC camp. Mr. Oby related.

Teachers Meeting—Jackson county upper grade teachers' council will meet in the auditorium of the courthouse here at 11 o'clock Saturday morning. Miss Delia M. Whitehead, assistant principal of Medford Junior high school, will give a talk on "Adjustment of Rural School Children to Junior High School."

Quint's Nurse Here—Miss S. Leroux, described as a nurse for the famed Dionne quintuplets, was a brief Medford visitor today. She arrived at Medford municipal airport on a United airliner from Portland at 11:45 a. m. and continued to Oakland, Cal., on the same plane at 11:59. She was traveling alone and during the stop here walked around the airport. Her mission was not disclosed.

Leases Hotel—P. G. Denson, former manager of the Hotel Medford and now operator of the Terminal hotel of Dunsmuir, Cal., was a business visitor here during the past few days. Denson has leased the Hotel Johnson at Visalia, Cal. which he will manage in conjunction with his Dunsmuir hotel. An extensive remodeling and refurbishing program is now under way for the Hotel Johnson. Mr. Denson said.

Snow at Resort—Three inches of snow covered the ground this morning at Lake of the Woods, Rogue River national forest headquarters announced. Word relayed from the ranger station at the lake said that elk hunting was proving a popular sport in the Fort Klamath area though only an unconfirmed report of one killed bull had been received. The ranger staff reported seeing five elk cows and a calf in the lake area, but no bulls.
