Wood-Pile Treasury in Good Shape. BEALCOURT, France (AP) - This taxless Picardy village boasts a surplus in its wood-pile "treasury." In the matter of selling bonds, the village finances all its projects, such as rural electrification, by selling wood from the communal forest. Volunteer workers who make a tax collector unnecessary have cut enough wood to meet any unexpected demands on the treasury.

NEW YORK, Nov. 11. - (AP) - The federal spending program for unemployment relief, the farm problem and such projects as the TVA were assailed as "the most vicious departure in our history from our constitution and traditions" by General Hugh S. Johnson today in an address at the 30th annual meeting of the Academy of Political Science at the Hotel Astor.

General Johnson said that the per capita cost of the federal government was \$109 in revolutionary times, that it was about \$250 under the Civil War and the World War. Between 1920 and 1932, the most was about \$35 per person, he added.

"The cost per head of the Washington government is now about \$70, and as the depression recedes, it continues to increase. This increase in actual spending is the humanly inconceivable sum of more than five billion dollars a year, or more per capita for the new 'vested interests' than for all the functions of government formerly considered legitimate since the beginning of our history."

SAY KING ADVISED WINDSOR TO DELAY. LONDON, Nov. 11. - (AP) - The News Review, a weekly news magazine, today published what it said was a telephone conversation between the Duke of Windsor and King George, and said the duke postponed his American trip on the advice of the king.

Before the postponement was announced, the magazine said, the duke called his brother from Paris and complained: "They know I am not a Fascist. I have been misled by friends and misunderstood by the public."

The king was said to have replied that he was sorry about the affair and that if he could do anything he would be only too glad.

"Whatever your advice, maybe I will follow it," the duke was quoted as saying.

The king thought for a moment, the magazine said, then expressed the view that because of what had happened he considered it wise to cancel the trip or postpone it indefinitely.

LOVE SONGS BANNED FOR WEDDING RITES IN CATHOLIC CHURCH

PORTLAND, Nov. 11. - (AP) - The Most Rev. Edward D. Howard, archbishop of Portland, in a regulation distributed today to the Roman Catholic churches of Oregon, forbade the playing of love songs and popular wedding marches at marital ceremonies. The message said that all frivolous music, either instrumental or vocal, should be discouraged, but that all "theatrical songs, duets, non-Catholic hymns, profane melodies or any song not approved by the ordinary are strictly forbidden" in marriage rites. Organists were instructed to see that their playing was not "sensuous in character nor unbecomingly and that in the playing of modern music there was nothing profane or indicative of 'motifs adopted in the theaters.'"

The archbishop, saying the purpose of the message was to obviate a recurrence of "such infractions" as have proceeded from ignorance or inadvertence, listed such selections as those which should not be played at weddings: Bridal chorus and wedding march from Lohengrin, Pilgrim's March from Tannhauser, Wedding March from Mendelssohn's Midsummer Night's Dream, Meditation from Massenet's Thais, Berceuse from Godard's Jocelyn, the aria from Saint Saens' Samson and Delilah, nor transcriptions of popular songs such as O Promise Me, Face to Face, Absent, At Dawning.

CONSTITUTION CHANGE AIM OF TOWNSENDITES IN INITIATIVE FILING

SALEM, Nov. 10. - (AP) - A movement to amend the federal constitution to provide for enactment of the Townsend old age pension plan was started here today when three state Townsend leaders filed an initiative measure to ask the legislature to request congress to call a constitutional convention. Glen C. Wade, Pendleton, Townsend manager for district two, would not comment on the action, but said that the legislature would be required to petition congress for a convention if voters approve today's initiative at the Nov. 8, 1938, general election. If the attorney general approves the petition's legal form, 20,020 signatures would place it on the ballot. Others who filed the petition were H. C. Epley, Salem, board member for the first district, and Arthur Moore, Monmouth, first district manager.

GEN. JOHNSON ASSAILS NEW DEAL'S SPENDING AS VICIOUS DEPARTURE

WASHINGTON, Nov. 11. - (AP) - The Agricultural Adjustment Administration announced today a 1938 range conservation program with benefit payments for observing range improving or conserving practices. The total amount of payments will depend on the amount of range building allowance for each ranch. State committee will determine practices applicable to each state. Except for some changes which AAA officials said should result in a more equitable distribution of payments, the program follows generally the provisions in effect this year. It will be effective in Arizona, California, Colorado, Idaho, Kansas, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Dakota, Texas, Utah, Washington and Wyoming.
