

Luise Rainer And Spencer Tracy In "Big City" On Craterian's Screen

STREET BATTLE IS THRILLING FEATURE OF DRAMATIC FILM

Luise Rainer and Spencer Tracy, whose fine characterizations in "Good Earth" and "Captains Courageous" have established them as two of the cinema capital's finest screen players, are co-starred for the first time in "Big City," opening today at the New Craterian theatre for a three-day showing.

A strictly modern story of a New York City cab driver and his immigrant wife, their shoulder-to-shoulder fight against the taxi racketeers and the fear of deportation facing the wife, "Big City" is entertainment of the popular sort, full of plenty of action, excitement, and moving at a fast tempo throughout. Also in featured roles of the picture are Charley Grapewin, Janet Beecher, Eddie Quillan, Victor Varconi, "Big Boy" Williams and Regis Toomey.

Of particular interest is the appearance in a realistic free-for-all street battle of such famous names of the sporting world as Jack Dempsey, James J. Jeffries, Maxie Rosenbloom, Jimmy McLarnin, Jim Thorpe, Man Mountain Dean, Bull Montana, Jackie Fields and many other ex-champions and near-champions.

A direct opposite of Miss Rainer's recent portrayals is the modern role she plays in the picture. Her new part places her as a simple Roumanian girl who has left her fatherland to come to America, the "land of hope," where she falls in love with a rough and ready taxicab driver, only to be precipitated into a dramatic catastrophe in which police courts, racketeers and Ellis Island loom up as forbidding aspects of her new civilization.

The latest issue of the "March of Time," in which the U. S. secret service is pictorially presented on the screen, is a special added attraction.
