CONDITIONED AIR IN NASH POPULAR

Weather conditions, despite the seasonal rains and cold spells, have brought no let-up in the number of demonstration rides in the new 1938 Nash cars. Walter W. Abbey, head of Walter W. Abbey, Inc., local dealer, reported yesterday.

"The snappy weather with the occasional rains of the past few days hold no terrors for a car with conditioned air, such as Nash pioneered this year," Abbey said.

Windows are closed, with the conditioned air unit adjusted and the interior of the car is as comfortable as on a balmy spring day, Abbey declared.

"The inclement weather, ordinarily the bane of the auto salesman's life, has only provided a dramatic contrast to the cars of other years when conditioned air was something you read about in railroad and movie theatre ads," Abbey said.

With the revolutionary conditioned air unit in operation, the new Nash speeds through wind and cold air rain while the interior is comfortably warmed with constantly changing air.

Windows do not fog up or steam; fresh, pure air is circulating through the car continually and the interior warmth can be regulated to as high as 80 degrees, Abbey declared.

The filter used in the conditioned air unit also serves to remove the moisture from the air, no matter how heavy the rainfall may be, thus assuring a supply of air which, Abbey asserted, guards against colds incurred from drafts and moist air.

'UNWRITTEN LAW' PLEAD BY KILLER

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 20.—(AP)—The "unwritten law" will be the defense for Paul Wright, airport manager charged with murdering his wife and his best friend when he found them embracing in his home.

Wright is charged with having shot Evelyn Wright and John Kimmel, airline executive, to death early the morning of November 9.

"The defense will stand or fall on the unwritten law," Jerry Giesler, attorney for Wright, declared. "We will not resort to an insanity plea. We will have no traffic with psychiatrists."

Wright is in the county jail. He will be arraigned in superior court December 6.

HARVARD VICTORY ENTHUSES HOOVER

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Nov. 20.—(AP)—Here is "just another football fan," former President Herbert Hoover today was on the winning side—rooting for a Harvard victory over Yale.

"There's no neutral in football," Hoover said.

Tonight he attended a dinner given by President James Conant of Harvard in honor of Dr. Charles Seymour, president of Yale.

He planned to return to New York tomorrow after spending the night at the home of Charles Francis Adams, former secretary of the navy.

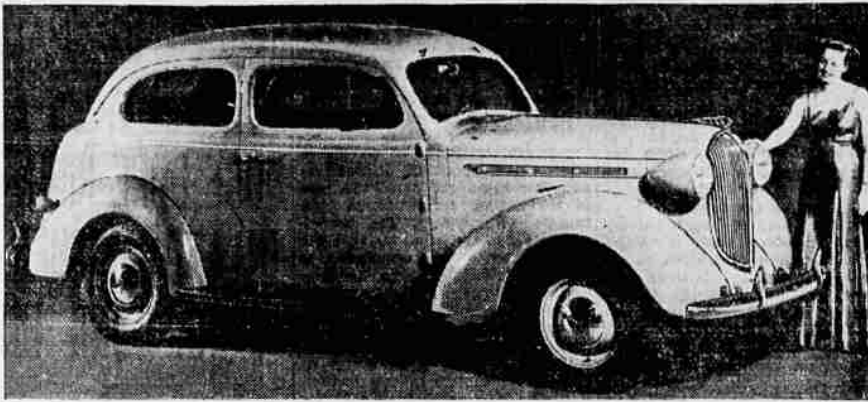

Furry Fish is Caught In Subterranean Lake

ST. LOUIS (UP)—A fur-bearing fish, caught in an underground lake on a Painesville county, Missouri, farm, may be a reversion to a possible ancient type of piscatorial life.

But, professing to be more of a fisherman than a biologist, Frank F. Wielandy, former Missouri state game and fish commissioner, presides to let science decide what manner of fish had chosen to strike his line.

The fish was taken out of what is called the trout pond on the acreage known as the Blue Bird



farm owned by the Wielandys and located near Waynesville, Mo. It was mounted and brought to St. Louis to be placed on exhibition.

The fish resembles a trout in every respect except that it has a rich coat of fur completely covering its body in longitudinal stripes, brown and grayish-yellow, much on the order of a chipmunk. The stripes run from snout to tail.

"I nominate it for a leading place in the book," Wielandy said, "for I doubt if there will be ever another freak just like this. In life it would weigh about two pounds. It has the head, jaws and snout of a trout. I frankly admit I can't explain it."

Wielandy suggested that inbreeding had produced a reversion to some long extinct type of fish. The pond in which the fish was taken was a small one. It was stocked by Wielandy. The fish was caught on an ordinary line with a young mouse as bait.

THE WINDSORS AT BAZAAR OPENING

PARIS, Nov. 20.—(UPI)—The Duchess of Windsor, in a smart black outfit purchased for the American trip that was abruptly cancelled, chose a fashionable Church of England affair today to make her debut as a public speaker.

Acceptance by the duke, who smiled as he talked, the duchess opened the annual bazaar of Christ Anglican church in the Salle Hoche and was enthusiastically applauded by the elite of the British colony.

The Rev. W. H. P. Coulidge, for 30 years rector of Christ church, invited the duke and duchess to open the bazaar in a friendly gesture that was regarded by many as an atonement for the action of another Anglican rector of Paris in rebuffing them on Armistice Day.

MOVIE MAGNATE'S WIFE IS KILLED

PALM SPRINGS, Cal., Nov. 20.—(UP)—Mrs. Bernice Mannix, 37, one of Hollywood's social leaders and wife of Edward Mannix, general manager of Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer studios, was killed early today when an automobile driven by Al Wertheimer, 48, night club operator, overtook on a highway two miles east of here.

Wertheimer suffered serious internal injuries and his shoulder and arm were broken.

School Life Begins at 70 For Illinois Old-Timers

(AP Feature Service) ELGIN, Ill.—Fifty men and women, none less than 70 years old, are going to school here to equip themselves for useful activity in the present-day scheme of things.

The school was started by Dr. Charles E. Sharp, 76-year old retired Elgin physician, who says he wanted to show the world that "old dogs can learn new tricks."

To put his idea into practice, the physician utilized an empty 16-room house he owned. In less than a month, his original student body of 17 increased to 50.

Five days a week, from 2 to 4 p. m., the men and women attend classes in knitting, tailoring, chart reading, upholstering, rug making, the deaf-mute sign language, German and French. They hear lectures on religion, economics and psychology. Several are studying music and nearly all gather around the piano for community sing.

The school is free. Instruction is donated by individuals and by the Y.M.C.A. and other organizations. Materials are provided by Elgin residents.

The oldest pupil is 87, the youngest 70.
