

# Robert Montgomery In Craterian's Comedy Romance Beginning Today

### ROSALIND RUSSELL CO-STARS IN FAST MOVING LAUGH HIT

Robert Montgomery and Rosalind Russell, in direct contrast to the dramatic "Night Must Fall," are co-starring in a rapidly-paced comedy-romance, "Live, Love and Learn," opening a three day showing today at the New Craterian theatre, Robert Benchley, famed humorist, has his most important film role to date, heading an outstanding supporting cast that also features Helen Vinson.

As a penniless young Greenwich Village artist who marries a rich society girl, wins startling success overnight, is lionized by the "400" and loses his head, his talents—and almost his wife—Montgomery is offered the greatest opportunity of his career to display all his genius for comedy and melodrama.

Miss Russell, as the rich society girl who renounces wealth and position to share the hard-earned life of a Greenwich Village Bohemian artist and who watches wealth ruin the fine talents of the man she married, has been provided with a vehicle which permits her full scope to show the world why she was made a star.

Fidelity of setting called forth all the talents of technical experts. A Greenwich Village studio in New York plays an important part in early sequences of the story. In strong contrast with the shabby garret set-sequences are the magnificent settings used for the period when Montgomery's sudden affluence prompts him to live beyond his means.

In important roles include Mickey Rooney, one of Hollywood's favorite juvenile actors, musical comedy from Broadway, musical comedy, E. E. Clive, Charles Judels, Maude Eburne, Harlan Briggs, June Clayworth and Al Shean.

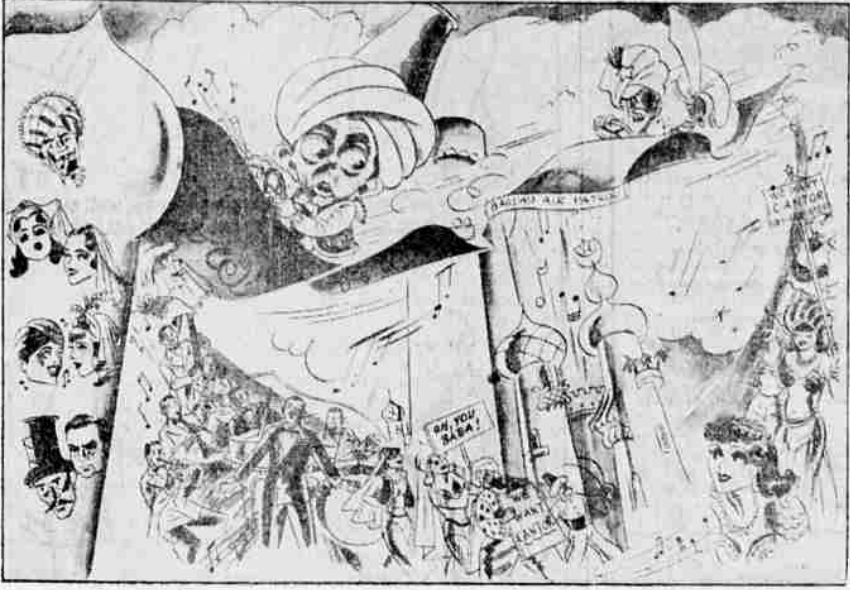

### HAWAII PLAYBOY GIVEN TEN YEARS FOR GIRL'S DEATH

HONOLULU, T. H., Nov. 20.—(AP)—Prince David Kalukaua Kawanakoa, last male descendant of Hawaii's kings pleaded guilty to a charge of manslaughter here today and was sentenced to ten years in Oahu penitentiary.

The prince was indicted on a charge of second degree murder early this month in connection with the death of Miss Angela Kinalea, 22-year-old part-Hawaiian with whom he was living.

The prince, who is 33 years old, also is under a ten-year sentence for the automobile death of Miss Felicity Connors of Fresno, Calif., killed in accident in 1932.

Kawanakoa's five-year probation granted in the Connors case was revoked recently on the ground he violated its terms by living with Miss Kinalea as man and wife.

Judge H. E. Stafford ordered both terms to run consecutively, making

a maximum of 20 years in prison. Kawanakoa's decision to plead guilty followed a conference with his mother, Princess Abigail Kawanakoa, yesterday. The prince was quoted as saying he still remembered nothing of Miss Kinalea's death, but had no desire to "drag her name through the courts."

NEW YORK—(UP)—The first one-man show of animal sculpture by Francois Pompon ever arranged will be held at the Brummer Galleries here for two months. Nearly half the present exhibition was lent by the French government. Sixty figures were lent by private collectors.

### SUSPEND LICENSE OF 177 DRIVERS DURING OCTOBER

SALEM, Nov. 20.—(AP)—A total of 177 Oregon drivers lost their operators' licenses by revocation or suspension during the month of October, Secretary of State Spell reported today. This established a new high monthly record.

"These revocations and suspensions occur in many cases where the driver can ill afford to lose his license," Spell said. "If more drivers realized the seriousness of such offenses as reckless or drunken driving they would be less prone to take a chance on getting away with it."

Previous high month was August, 1937, when 156 licenses were suspended or revoked. The lowest month on record was January, 1933, with only 17.

Multnomah and Klamath county again headed the list of revocations and suspensions with 34 and 14 respectively.

### Kenny Baker Sings In Rialto Musical Hit Opening Today

Kenny Baker, whom every radio fan knows and likes, makes his screen debut as a full-fledged movie star, at the Rialto theatre today and tomorrow only.
