TRAPPER RECEIVES \$222 FOR COYOTES

This morning Vernon Hopkins walked into County Clerk George Carter's office. A few minutes later he walked out with \$222.

The money was paid to him as a bounty on 74 coyotes trapped in the past 28 days in the Greenup and Dead Indian areas. This was the largest number of coyotes ever turned in and the largest bounty ever turned out to one man at one time, Mr. Carter said. The trapper retains the pelts which, on the average, can be sold for more than the bounty, he added.

Mr. Hopkins works on his father's Greenup ranch. He is considered one of the best trappers in southern Oregon. Just a month ago, Mr. Carter said, he collected the bounty of \$3 each on 64 coyotes.
