

NOVICE BANDITS BEATEN, HELD BY S. P. TRAIN CREW

told officers who questioned them, when they decided to see the west. They spent some time in El Paso, where they bought horses and cowboy regalia. Then they went to Deming, in southwest New Mexico near the Mexican border. They spent several weeks there, returned to El Paso and planned the train holdup to obtain needed funds.

Near Mt. Smith, one drew a gun, forcing Conductor W. M. Holloway to the front of the train. Brakeman Jim Velsir next was directed there and both were guarded by one bandit while the other proceeded through the train, removing money and valuables from the 150 passengers.

General Fight Starts

Near Hachita, N. M., they commanded the brakeman to signal the train to stop and tried to leave the front coach. That was the signal for the general fight.

Smith, who was one of the first to grapple with the bandits; Roger Moon, 29, husky Southern Pacific yardman from Douglas, Ariz., and Sipple Webb, 65-year-old El Paso Negro, who tripped Dwyer as Dwyer ran up the coach to aid Lorenz, received liberal praise from the train's passengers for the part they played in capturing the pair.

Moon knocked one bandit unconscious, then went to the aid of Smith, who had been fatally wounded. Sheriff Joe Vismontes of Las Cruces said he had learned that Lorenz is a native of Frankfurt, Germany, and Dwyer a native of Nova Scotia. He said he was sending their fingerprints to the federal bureau of investigation at Washington.

Dwyer today was suffering from a severely lacerated mouth. His left eye, badly cut, was closed. Lorenz complained volubly of the rough treatment dealt out by the passengers.

FEHL HEARING SLATED FOR NEXT WEDNESDAY; JURY WILL BE CALLED

Wednesday, December 1, has been set by Circuit Judge H. D. Norton, for the hearing on the insanity proceedings instituted against Earl H. Fehl, former county judge of Jackson county, Judge Norton, acting as the county judge, when the regular county judge, Earl B. Day, preside. The court has announced a jury will be drawn to hear the case. Fehl is held in the county jail.

Three Portland alienists, Dr. D. C. Burkes, Dr. H. H. Dixon and Dr. C. O. Sturdevant, filed a physician's certificate and report Wednesday alleging that Fehl is insane and suffering from paranoia and "in need of institutional care for his own protection, and the protection of others." The alienists were named by the court to conduct an examination of Fehl, which they did last Saturday.

The court has also requested that Attorney Forier J. Neff, of this city, continue as Fehl's counsel in the insanity proceedings.

The complaint, signed by Fred Kelly, Medford, charges Fehl is "an insane person and dangerous to be at large."

RARE TRANSFUSION NEEDED TO SAVE 2

WINDSOR, Ontario, Nov. 26.—(Canadian Press)—The lives of two young men afflicted with a rare and deadly infection, known as streptococcus viridans, were at stake today as doctors searched for an even rarer rare type of blood donor.

In addition to having type four blood—the same as the victims of the infection—the donor sought must be one who has recovered from streptococcus viridans, and recoveries are few.

Doctors attending Weston W. Fletcher, 28, and Robert Shafer, 17, conceded the person they need for a blood transfusion would be hard to find and that there was little hope for recovery of Fletcher. His chances are 1000 to 1.

Young Shafer is in much better condition. Doctors say he has a "fighting chance" to live but a transfusion would make his recovery more certain.

NOTRE DAME, TROJANS TO CONTINUE RIVALRY

SOUTH BEND, Ind., Nov. 26.—(AP)—Southern California and Notre Dame, which meet for the 12th straight year Saturday, will continue their inter-sectional football rivalry through 1941. Elmer Layden, athletic-director and head coach of the Irish, announced today.

Already scheduled to meet in 1938 and 1939, the two institutions have agreed on dates for the next two years. Notre Dame will play at Los Angeles December 7, 1940, and the Trojans will return to South Bend November 22, 1941.
