

# FILM COSTS RISE AS DOG REHEARSES FOR SMALL SCENE

Entire Day Spent As Hound Is Coached for Sequence Lasting But 15 Seconds — Much Meat Required

 HOLLYWOOD, Nov. 25. — (UP) — M-G-M will be figuring far into tonight, trying to discover how many thousands of dollars it cost today to make a 15-second scene in which a dog woke up from a snooze on the floor, stretched, heard an intruder outside, and barked three times.  
 The dog's name was Luke and he was smart as a Missouri hound ever gets, but it took the combined efforts of Director Clarence Brown, all his assistants, Luke's trainer and half a dozen actors, a pound of meat and most of the day to turn the trick.  
 When it was finished, Luke wagged his tail wearily and went to sleep without the help of anybody.  
 Old Crane's Mutt.  
 The picture is entitled "Benefits Forgot," in which Walter Huston is a circuit riding preacher in Ohio in 1850. The scene shows an old log house in which lives one of Parson Huston's parishioners, Leona Roberts. She plays the part of an old crone, sitting before the fire, smoking her pipe, with Luke on the floor beside her. The fire consists of blue-blazing "photoflame," which is a cot-

tony substance which burns with the odor of gunpowder. Ordinary flame won't do in a movie fireplace because it is reddish and yellowish and hence films black.  
 Miss Roberts' pipe is a real corn-cob, but it doesn't contain smoking tobacco. It's loaded with a crumpled cigarette, so she won't get sick.  
 Trouble With Tail.  
 Luke is a mighty dirty-looking hound, made that way with lamp-black carefully smeared onto his red and white coat. His trainer, Rennie Renfrew, does the dirty work, getting his hands far blacker than he does Luke, who wags his tail all through the process.  
 When Luke's appearance is bad enough to suit everybody, Renfrew places him on the floor at Miss Roberts' feet. Luke's tail thumps the boards, Renfrew sheds with him to stop, to act sleepily. Luke shuts his eyes, but somehow he can't keep his tail still.  
 Luke is supposed to stay on the floor until he hears a noise outside the door. Then he is to jump up, go toward the door, stop three paces in front of it, and bark. He can't go any closer, else he'll get outside the camera's range. This is getting a little complicated, even for a hound as intelligent as Luke. It's particularly hard for him to understand, because Renfrew must stay out of sight of the camera.  
 Slow Process.  
 Renfrew gets on the other side of the door and shoves a piece of meat through a chink in it. Luke bounds for the meat. That's no go. Luke can't eat until he's barked and he can't bark until he stops three feet from the door.  
 Renfrew explains it all to him carefully. Luke listens and then they rehearse. Luke makes a lot of mistakes but after each try Renfrew pats him on the head, tells him he's doing fine, and gives him another chunk of meat. As the hours go by, with their attendant charges being added up by the bookkeeping department, Luke gets the whole rou-

time down pat, and does it perfectly. All hands congratulate him and he goes to sleep, even ignoring the extra big piece of beef that Renfrew offers him as a final reward.

# TALKS OF VALUE TO PUBLIC LISTED ON PROGRAM HERE

Lectures and Displays Are Planned to Interest Lay Persons at Meeting of Horticultural Society

Program for the meeting of the Oregon State Horticultural Society at the Elks temple here on December 2 and 3 lists many interesting speakers. Along with the usual discussions of new developments in production practices are listed some topics that are considered unusual in a program of this type.

The canning industry, for instance, has been given an opportunity to present its views in the perennial controversy between canners and producers. Mark Ewald and Merton Hill of the Olympia Canning company, Olympia, Wash., will discuss "Problems of the Pear Canning Industry."

The program committee said it was fortunate that these two men accepted the invitation to speak and urges all growers interested in closer cooperation between growers and canners to be present at 2:30 p. m. Thursday, December 2. "The canning industry doubtless has just as distressing problems as the grower and in fairness to the industry all growers should turn out to hear what they are," the committee stated.  
 Frozen Food Display  
 "Another unusual topic of interest to the general public and one that no housewife can afford to miss is

a discussion and display of frozen food by H. Campbell of the United States frozen food laboratory of Seattle, Wash. This feature will include a display of frozen foods for examination and sampling, a discussion by Mr. Campbell, and questions and answers on frozen foods and their use in the home," the committee announcement stated.  
 "Some frozen food enthusiasts declare that this process will largely supersede canning as a form of food preservation in the next 10 years. This is the last feature on the program and will be presented at 7:30 Friday evening, December 3, in the basement of the Elks temple. There will be no admission charges and nothing to sell. You are invited to see this educational demonstration of frozen foods."
