### RELIGIOUS FREEDOM DENIED AMISH SECT SAYS PENNSYLVANIAN

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 2.—(AP)—Pennsylvania, carved from the 17th century wilderness as a haven where all might worship in peace, was accused today of denying a modern sect full religious freedom.  
Aaron King, picturesque Amishman from the heart of the Pennsylvania "Dutch" country, pleaded in federal district court that the commonwealth was trying to take from the "plain people" some of the rights that William Penn guaranteed to all in 1682 in his famous "Frame of Government."  
King, with flowing beard and

barbed in the sombre frock of his sect, came from his fertile farm at Honeybrook to Penn's "City of Brotherly Love" to protest the state's effort to force his daughter, Rebecca, to attend school.  
Judge George A. Welsh took the case under advisement after hearing testimony of King's daughter, Rebecca, that "she didn't want to go to school." He ordered John N. Landberg, counsel for King, to submit additional briefs.  
The Amish faith, King asserted, frowned on schooling for its followers after the age of 14 as conducive to undesirable "worldliness." Rebecca is 14.  
Pennsylvania's school law requires that all youngsters attend classes at least until they are 15.

### SAVANTS WILL STUDY WHY SOME ATHLETES BETTER THAN OTHERS

MINNEAPOLIS, Dec. 2.—(AP)—Why is one athlete a tenth of a second faster than another in the 100-yard dash? Why can one man jump an inch higher than another? Where does a shot-putter get the extra push to nose out an opponent? And—what, if any, will be the effects on his health later?  
These are the questions researchers at the University of Minnesota will try to answer in a study by the department of athletics and the medical school. Dr. Axel Keys, formerly of the Mayo Foundation at Rochester, Minn., will conduct the survey.

"We are not concerned with the development of better athletes," Dr. Keys said today, "but with the individual differences, such as those that make one man a better runner or jumper than another."  
"We want to know what happens when a person engages in strenuous physical exercises under various conditions. We are particularly interested in exchanges between blood and tissue during exercise and recovery."
