JAPAN
After 200 years of complete national isolation from the rest of the world, in little more than a century the Japanese empire has risen to a power of international importance in literary, artistic, military and scientific fields, none of which, strange as it seems, is their own!

BUDDHISM is basically Japan's religion and Christianity today stands on an even basis with it. Buddhism was introduced to Japan from Korea in 552 A. D. and in 1875 Christianity found a footing there with the founding of the Doshisha Theological school.

Japan's written language also came from China, through Korea. However, as the Japanese spoken language differs from the Chinese, the monosyllabic characters of the Chinese were necessarily modified to fit the polysyllabic Japanese tongue.

Experts can trace Japan's art to China and India, through the Japanese conquest of Korea. In fact, there is little of the island empire's civilization that originated at home.

With the political revolution in Japan of 1868 in which the power of the mikado was restored, her bars were let down and in the next half century she underwent one of the most remarkable modernizations in history, changing from an obscure Asiatic country to one of world importance in manufacturing, education and other phases of life.
