

K. F. BOY KILLED AS CAR HITS NAG

KLAMATH FALLS, Dec. 3.—(AP)—Allan Chilcote, 18, Klamath Falls, died early today of injuries suffered when the car in which he was riding collided with a horse last night on the Weed highway south of here.

The collision lifted the horse onto the hood of the car and into the windshield, buckling the frame and breaking off both front doors. The machine careened into a ditch and overturned. The horse was badly mangled.

Thomas Hatfield, driver of the car, said he thought it was the upset rather than the collision that injured Chilcote. Besides Chilcote, one of six others in the automobile was hurt.

Chilcote suffered a skull fracture and punctured lungs.

Mrs. Odum Breaks Air Speed Record

MIAMI, Fla., Dec. 3.—(AP)—Jacqueline Cochran, wife of the financier, Floyd B. Odum, smashed the New York-to-Miami speed record today when she flew the 1170 miles in 4 hours, 12 minutes and 38 seconds.

The previous record, set by the late Jimmy Weddell of Louisiana in 1933, was 5 hours, 1 minute, although Frank Hawks flew from East Hartford, Conn., in 4 hours, 55 minutes last April.

Baker Area Mills Close For Winter

BAKER, Dec. 3.—(AP)—Business conditions and inclement weather have collaborated to such an extent in Baker county and surrounding territory that by the end of this week lumber operations in the county will be completely suspended.

Officials of the Stoddard and Oregon Lumber companies stated that the weather had made roads virtually impassable for lumber vehicles and that marketing conditions were of such a nature to further make it advisable to halt operations in the plants.

Muffins Somerset (Makes Eight)
1 1/2 cups mashed bananas
1 1/2 cups flour
1 cup bran
1 1/2 teaspoons soda
2-3 teaspoon salt
1-3 cup granulated sugar
1 egg
1/4 cup sour cream
2-3 cup raisins
1 teaspoon vanilla
Press bananas through a strainer. Add to the rest of the ingredients. Beat for one minute. Half-fill greased muffin pans and bake for 25 minutes in a moderately slow oven.

Fruit Salad Bowl
1 cup diced pineapple
1 cup grapefruit segments
1 cup cress or shredded lettuce
1/2 cup diced celery
1/2 teaspoon salt
1-3 cup French dressing
Mix ingredients in a bowl. Chill. Toss with spoon and fork. Serve immediately.

Corn Spoon Bread
1 cup corn meal
1 cup corn, cooked
2-3 cup flour
1 teaspoon salt
3 teaspoons baking powder
1 tablespoon granulated sugar
3 eggs, beaten
1 1/2 cups milk
1-3 cup fat, melted
Mix ingredients and beat together for two minutes. Pour into a buttered baking dish. Set in a pan of water and bake for one hour in a moderate oven.
