

# OREGON ASSURED OF FULL SHARE IN ROAD MONEY

Senator Reames Telegraphs Salem Chamber of Commerce House Committee to Restore Fiscal Quotas

SALEM, April 15.—(AP)—President Roosevelt's fireside chat last night virtually assured Oregon that it would receive its full \$3,000,000 share of federal funds for road construction.

R. H. Baldoak, state highway engineer said today.

Congress authorized \$238,000,000 in its federal road aid program for the 1938 fiscal year ending next July 1, but only \$138,000,000 has been appropriated. The president said he would recommend to congress that it appropriate the additional \$100,000,000.

Senator A. E. Reames (D-Ore) telegraphed the Salem chamber of commerce today that the house appropriations committee promised to restore the full quota of federal road funds for both the 1938 and 1939 fiscal years, and that the president had released funds for federal forest roads and trails and federal land roads.

The president's statement also removed the threat to cut the appropriations in half for the 1938 fiscal year.

## RACKET KING FACES LIFETIME IN PRISON

NEW YORK, April 15.—(AP)—A threat of a lifetime in prison instead of the two years he served to serve, today hung over Jacob (Gurrah) Shapiro, bull-necked king of the rackets and reputed ally of midwestern underworld.

The threat came from the possibility that, while already serving one term and facing trial in two more cases, he might be indicted again under the 1934 federal anti-rackets act which provides a possible maximum sentence of 99 years.

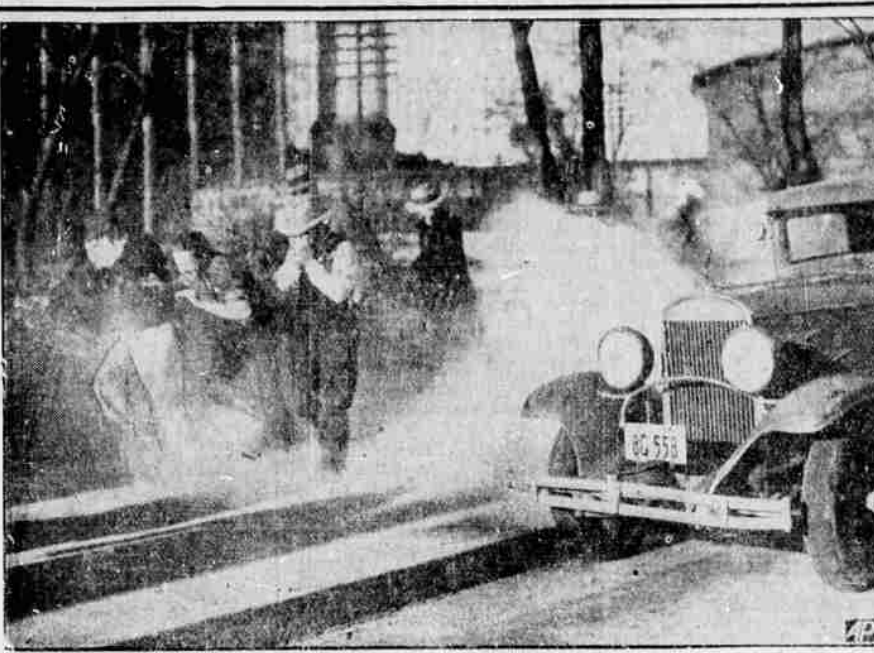
## BOBBY JONES BECOMES SPORTING GOODS MOGUL

### Illinois Winner

Congressman Scott W. Lucas turned on a smile of victory when it was indicated he had captured the Illinois Democratic nomination for U. S. senator from U. S. District Attorney Michael L. Igoe of Chicago, backed by the Kelly-Nash machine. Lucas, of Havana, Ill., was supported by Gov. Henry L. Horner.
