

# INSURGENT FORCES ENTER VINAROS TO COMPLETE WEDGE

## Franco's Columns Succeed in Separating Catalonia Capital From Remainder of Government Territory

BURGOS, Spain, April 15.—(AP)—Insurgent forces of general Miguel Aranda today entered Vinaros, Mediterranean coastal city on the highway linking Barcelona with the rest of government Spain.

Aranda's hard driving columns earlier in the day had advanced along the highway from San Mateo through San Jorge toward the sea.

Occupation of Vinaros would mean that Generalissimo Francisco Franco's five-week-old drive had at last reached the Mediterranean and the insurgent wedge had been driven between Catalonia, containing the government capital, Barcelona, and the rest of government territory.

The new, all-white kitchen is arranged for quick service. New electric French fry pots have been installed. New hamburger and steak cube machines will prepare the meat for Franklin's de luxe hamburger and cube steak sandwiches.

The floor is blue and grey tile with Chinese red border and the fountain stools are covered with blue and yellow leather.

Restaurant men who have inspected the new place say it is the best equipped and most beautiful cafe in the state.

"In modernizing this restaurant all new fixtures, with two or three exceptions, have been installed. They are the very latest type and design it is possible to obtain, which enables us to now offer to our patrons the very best food and fountain dishes.

In planning this new cafe several weeks were spent in Portland and San Francisco studying the latest equipment. Many large kitchens were studied in planning the arrangement of ours so that we might offer the fastest service possible."
