

PEACE OFFICERS TRAINING SCHOOL HERE TOMORROW

Ex-Special Agent of F.B.I. Will Speak—Officers of Nearby Cities Will Attend Four Class Sessions

First of a series of four classes in the peace officers' training school will be held Tuesday at 2 p. m. in the council chambers in city hall, with C. C. Spears, ex-special agent of the federal bureau of investigation, dealing with the subject, "Salesmanship in Law Enforcement."

Law enforcement officers of Medford, Grants, Pass, Ashland, Gold Hill, Rogue River and Central Point are expected to attend. Police Chief Clatus McCredie of Medford is chairman for this district.

The classes, sponsored by the League of Oregon Cities, the University of Oregon and the federal bureau of investigation for the purpose of acquainting police officers with the latest developments in crime detection and all phases of police work, will be held in seven Oregon cities over a period of four weeks. Classes in Medford will be held the next four Tuesdays.

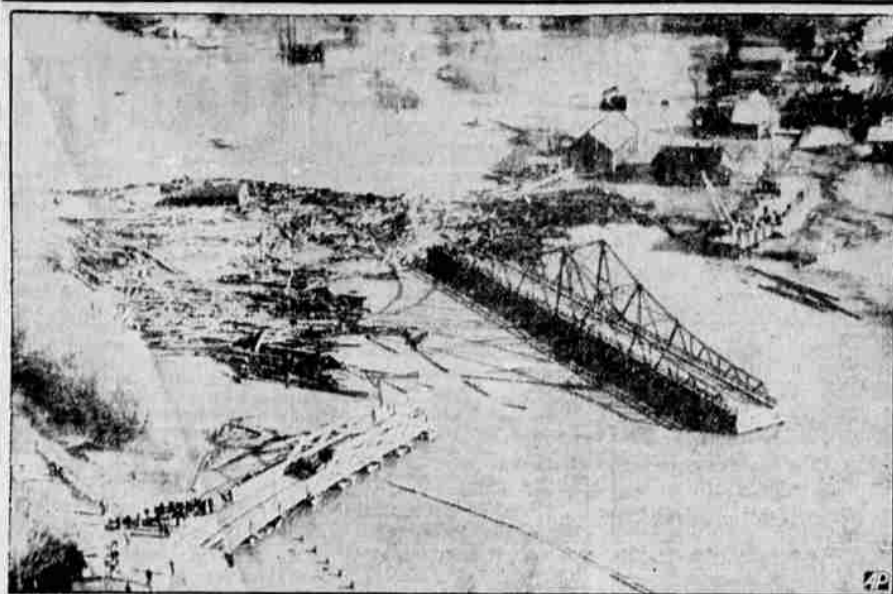
Orville R. Williams, detective of the Portland police bureau, will instruct Medford's second class, May 3, on the subject, "Analysis of Crimes." May 10, Spears will address officers on "The Modern Law Enforcement Officer." The final class, May 17, will be under the instruction of Williams, and will deal with "Developing an Investigative Procedure."

Other cities to conduct classes on different days in the week are Klamath Falls, Eugene, Albany, Astoria, La Grande, The Dalles.

MRS. A. W. HERBERT DIES AT CORVALLIS HOME OF DAUGHTER

Mrs. A. W. Herbert, mother of Mrs. Ralph Billings of Ashland, died in her sleep Friday night in the home of her daughter, Mrs. E. A. Blake, at Corvallis. She was 89 years old. Her death came as a sudden shock, as she had not been ill.

Funeral services will be held Tuesday in Crescent City, where Mr. Herbert is buried.

Mrs. Herbert spent the past year at the home of Mrs. Billings, county commissioner. She left a few days before Easter to visit Mrs. Blake.

Mrs. Herbert was born in New Paris, Ind., June 11, 1849. She spent her childhood in Wisconsin and later taught school in Missouri. She was married to Augustus W. Herbert on May 30, 1872, in Wisconsin.

Mr. and Mrs. Herbert came to the Willamette valley in the early eighties. In 1908 they took up residence in Ashland.

Mrs. Herbert is survived by six children: Mrs. Ralph Billings and Mrs. R. N. Chaney, Ashland; Mrs. E. A. Blake, Corvallis; S. D. Herbert and Mrs. C. C. Clark, Seaside, Calif.; and Mrs. A. B. Bower, Crescent City, Calif. Seven grandchildren also survive.
