SPORTS British Fed Up With Seeing Yankees Grab Sport Titles

LONDON, April 28.—(AP)—The British are a patient people, but now, as the Irish say, "they've had their sufficient."

Bob Jones and Walter Hagen took their golf titles and they loved it. Don Budge rubbed it in last year by winning three Wimbledon titles and the Davis cup. Prior to this America had won the Ryder cup, the Walker cup, the Westchester cup, the Curtis cup and the America's cup.

All these Britain lost with rare equanimity, but when Battelshup carried off the Grand National steelpiece trophy, it was practically the end.

Fear Derby Loss Now only three of this season's British sporting classes remain in British hands—the derby at Ascot, June 1; the British open golf championship at Deal, July 4-8; and the British women's golf championship at Burnham and Berraw May 16-20.

With Henry Cotton and Pam Barton playing in top form, it is doubtful if America's limited challenge in the two golfing classes will have much chance.

But some English critics are already seeing the possibility of the derby going to an American-owned horse.

There are, at this early date, four horses owned by J. E. Widener and William Woodward entered in the derby. Widener has the fifth favorite, Unbreakable, at 14 to 1 and Silver Spear II, at 25 to 1. Woodward has Olympus at 20 to 1 and Valerian III, an unknown quantity not listed in the early betting books.
