Afternoon and Evening Program in High School to Mark Work in County by College Extension Staff

Home economics extension service which brings to the homemakers a program of adult education has been a part of Oregon's program for 20 years and of Jackson county for 20 years. Jackson was the first county in the state to become a part of the statewide program. Throughout the past year, projects which have been carried in this county include clothing and textiles, home furnishing, nutrition and parent education and child development.

A complete new sea foods department has been opened at the Peerless Market under the management of K. S. Anderson, according to an announcement today by Merle Jarmin of the Peerless.

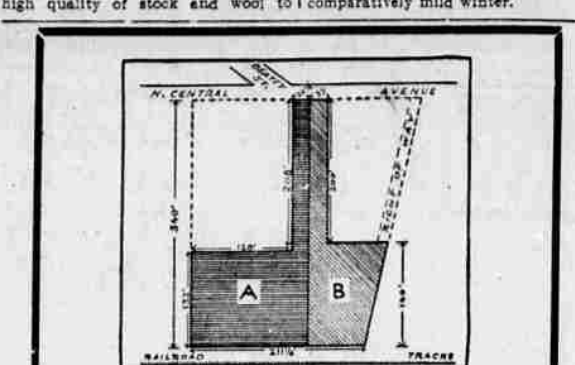

Police Swarm Rome for Hitler's Visit

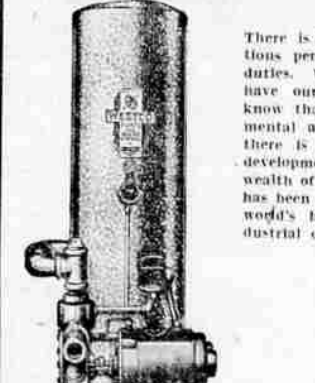
