'THUMBER' GIVEN TEN DAYS IN JAIL

Sherman Alton Whitacre, 25, transient hailing from New Hampshire and headed for Reno, charged with soliciting rides on the Pacific highway near Ashland, was sentenced to ten days in the county jail by Justice of the Peace William R. Coleman Monday. It was the second time the state law has been invoked against hitch-hiking. The arresting officer told the court Whitacre was persistent in his "hitching" and ignored a warning to move on.

James R. Trotter, charged with overloading a truck, telegraphed the court he entered a plea of guilty, and was fined \$11 and costs. Trotter forfeited \$25 bail and from this amount paid a previous fine for not possessing a PUC permit.

OTTINGERS PLAN APPEAL IN CASE

Notice of appeal to the state supreme court in the damage suit of Margaret Boardman, former Chamber of Commerce employe, in which she was awarded judgment for \$200 by a circuit court jury, was filed yesterday by J. L. Ottinger and wife, former operators of the Jackson Hot Springs on the Pacific highway near Ashland.

The judgment was rendered in a personal injury suit in which the plaintiff charged that while swimming in the pool she was struck in the head by a water ball, causing her head to strike the concrete edge and inflicting head injuries.

Attorneys George M. Roberts and W. M. McAllister represent the Ottingers, the plaintiffs. Boardman is represented by the plaintiff.

COUNTRY SCHOOLS SET CLOSING DAY

Closing dates for the Trail district school and the Rose Creek district school have been set for Friday, May 18, according to the county school superintendent's office.

The Griffin Creek and Meadows schools will close Thursday, May 19. The Bell Creek, Antelope, Dunsmuir, Froot and Derby schools will close Friday, May 20.

Wards Creek school will close Wednesday, May 25, and the Brownsboro, Dead Indian and Watkins schools on Friday, May 27.

Remaining schools of the county have not yet filed their closing dates with the county school superintendent.
