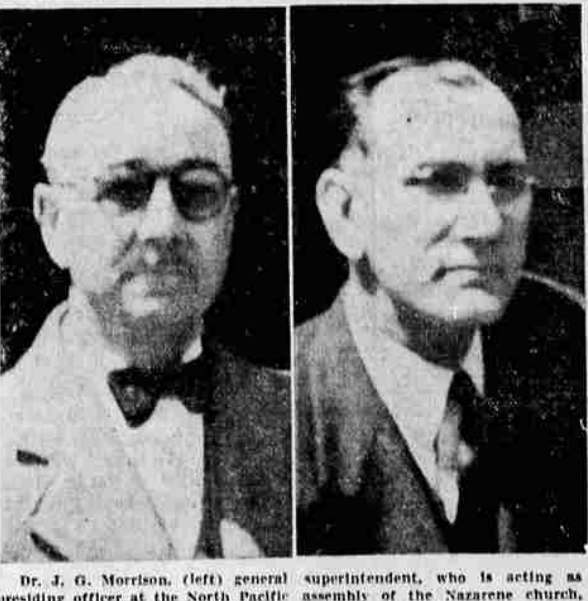
CHINESE TAKE BACK HALF OF TERRITORY CAPTURED BY JAPS
