ROLLO CONFESSES PROWLING DOZEN RESIDENCES HERE

(Continued from page one.) He knew nothing about the home of Mr. and Mrs. Charles J. Pritchett at 311 South King street which was entered last Sunday night.

Investigation by city police revealed he owes \$20 room rent at the Hotel Jackson. Police learned he had paid his bill on April 25 up to April 29, an amount of \$12.70.

Chief McCredie said Rollo admitted two house robberies in Portland, one of which was a policeman's home where he stole a gold star, a gun and a gold watch.

On the night of May 4 the house of Oris Crawford at 814 West Main street was robbed by Rollo.

Chief McCredie said Rollo named the Jauds house as the first he burglarized, obtaining a ruby stud pin, a nurse's pin, two rings, a hospital ring, a fraternity pin, a gold cross and chain and the Colt automatic.
