WASHINGTON, May 6.—(P)—An interested commerce commission examiner recommended today dismissal of a complaint by Representative Mitchell (D-III.) that he suffered

from discrimination when he was put in a "Jim Crow" car in Arkansas about a year ago. The examiner, William A. Disque, said the "present colored coach meets the requirements of the law." Mitchell, only negro member of congress, was compelled to ride in such a coach.

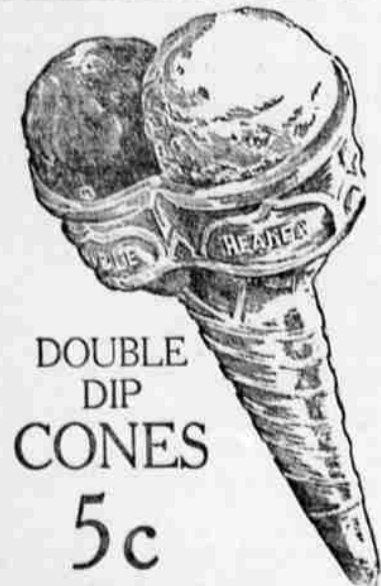
