The long-awaited run of Chinook salmon in Rogue river has started. According to word received from Rainbow Gibson, 15 big fellows were landed at Savage Rapids dam yesterday, in ideal water, and fishing should be good for the next two months.

Gibson sent the following telegram to the Mail Tribune: "Come and get them! At last the big salmon runs have started to show up in the Rogue river almost a month later than usual. Twenty salmon hooked and 15 landed yesterday at Savage Rapids dam. Fishing will be good for the next two months."

Among Medford anglers landing salmon were Dr. and Mrs. Jarrett

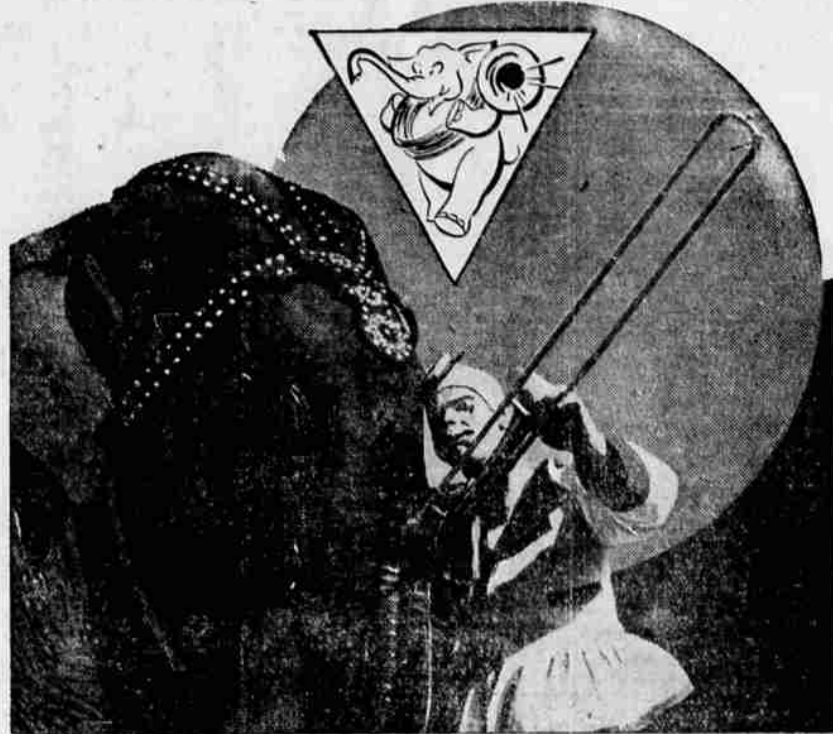
