

SPECIAL COUNTY SERVICE PLANNED TO AID AIRMAIL

Ceremonies will mark the Rogue valley's special airmail service during National Airmail Week May 15 to 21. It was announced yesterday by Postmaster Frank DeSouza.

The special service will be provided on Thursday, May 19 when a private plane given official status for the day, will connect Medford, Grants Pass, Roseburg, Cottage Grove and Portland.

The plane, flown by Thomas A. Culbertson, Jr., president of Medford chapter of the National Aeronautic association, will leave municipal airport at 10:30 a. m. Mayor C. C. Furnas will officiate at the departure. He will assist Lorraine Young, six-year old daughter of Postal Inspector and Mrs. Harold Young, in placing the first bag of airmail aboard the plane. The public is invited to attend the ceremony.

Plane schedule for the special airmail flight is: arrive Grants Pass 10:45, depart 10:55; arrive Roseburg 11:20, depart 11:30; arrive Cottage Grove 12 noon, depart 12:10; arrive Portland 1:30. At Portland all the mail will be dispatched by regular commercial airmail lines. At each city postmasters are arranging special ceremonies in recognition of the first stop of an official airmail plane. Mr. DeSouza said.

To benefit fully from the special, authorized airmail service out of Medford, Mr. DeSouza is arranging schedules for the pick-up of airmail in all parts of the county. The airmail thus collected will be dispatched from here on the special plane. Meantime all rural carriers working out of Medford will procure data on the probable volume of airmail during National Airmail Week. Blanks will be left for each boxholder and Mr. DeSouza asked that these be filled out and returned as quickly as possible.

SPANISH REBELS NEAR ROAD LINK

HENDAYE, France (at the Spanish frontier), May 7.—(P)—Spanish insurgents tore a gap through government defenses in eastern Spain today and advanced five miles nearer the "lifeline" highway link between Madrid and the Mediterranean ports of Castellon De La Plana and Valencia.

Insurgent commanders reported the government line was broken 40 miles north and slightly to the west of Castellon where they captured the town of Portell, deep in the pocket protecting the government's central coast lines.

MARTHA TO FIGHT DAD'S MONEY PLEA

LOS ANGELES, May 7.—(AP)—Martha Raye gave legal notice today that she intends to contest the maintenance suit brought against her by her father, Peter F. Reed.

She answered his action by filing in superior court a statement that she paid him \$35 a week in addition to other expenses up to the time he demanded an accounting for her earnings as a film comedienne. She says the suit abrogated the agreement.

As a further defense, Miss Raye says her father is able, but unwilling, to seek employment.

JOAN BENNETT AT DERBY IS ROBBED

LOUISVILLE, Ky., May 7.—(AP)—Miss Joan Bennett, Hollywood film actress who came here to see the Kentucky derby, reported today that jewelry she valued at between \$25,000 and \$30,000 was stolen from her hotel room.

The theft was revealed to Louisville police tonight by John L. Kilgarriff, Louisville attorney representing the actress' Hollywood insurance company.

Detective Chief William A. Oeltjen said the stolen gems included a platinum- emerald- diamond ring valued at \$10,000, a diamond ring valued at \$5,000, a diamond and ruby sapphire and four diamond bracelets.

'HOT CARGO' BANS FACING PROTEST

SEATTLE, May 7.—(AP)—Mr. M. G. Ringenberg of the Waterfront Employers' association said tonight he would protest to federal labor and commerce departments Monday over action of the Sailors' Union of the Pacific in picketing and halting operations on five ships in the Seattle harbor.

The ships were picketed as part of the union's "hot cargo" ban on commerce for or from the closed port of Tacoma.

Peter B. Gill of the sailors' union predicted other tieups as other ships arrive here with Tacoma cargo. Five vessels were tied up here today.

HITLER, IL DUCE SEAL PLEDGE IN 'FIDELITY TOASTS'

ROME, May 7.—(P)—Benito Mussolini and Adolf Hitler "completed and sealed" their alliance tonight in an exchange of fidelity toasts at a formal state dinner in Palazzo Venezia.

The fuhrer guaranteed "for all time" the Alpine border between Germany and Italy.

"It is my unshakable will and also my political testament to the German people," he declared, "to consider inviolable for all time the frontiers of the Alps-erected between us by nature."

(Germany extended her territory to Italy's northern border March 13 when Hitler annexed Austria.)

The dinner brought to a climax a week's visit filled with military demonstrations, pageantry and political discussions whose import the world probably will not know until time discloses them.

The short speeches of the two dictators lacked concrete details of what they intend to do about Caechoalovakia, where a Nazi German minority is clamoring for autonomy, and other problems which were said to have been discussed.

CLUB WOMEN LOSE OUT TO FIGHTERS

KANSAS CITY, May 7.—(AP)—Officials of the General Federation of Women's Clubs protested when they learned a prize fight was scheduled for next Wednesday night at the Municipal auditorium arena.

They had planned to hold a symposium of "religion and democracy" there at their triennial convention. City Manager H. F. McElroy ruled for the athletes.

"The Municipal auditorium is for the people," he said. "It is as much for a prize fight as a women's club—and there's not a lot of difference between the two anyway."

ETHIOPIAN ISSUE NETTLES LEAGUE

GENEVA, May 7.—(P)—The diplomatic "battle of the year" will open here Monday over the question of recognition of Ethiopia as part of the Italian empire.

The League of Nations council will open its 101st meeting then on the second anniversary of Italy's annexation of the East African nation.

A single adverse vote could wreck a council decision. No unanimous vote, however, is required for a mere recommendation by the council—usually the practice on questions of procedure.

Ethiopia's legal existence as an independent state, league quarters indicated tonight, may be treated as just that—a mere question of procedure.

GOVERNOR STAND HIT BY OSBORNE

PORTLAND, May 7.—(P)—Gov. Charles H. Martin's description of himself as a champion of labor was challenged today by Ben T. Osborne, secretary of the state federation of labor with the assertion that the governor fought the unemployment

compensation bill before the legislature.

Osborne claimed the governor had denounced New Deal legislation on this act and threatened to veto the Oregon enabling act. He abandoned his position, however, when employees displayed favor toward the measure, the labor leader declared.

An assertion that Martin had shied away from intervening in labor violence last fall also came from Osborne, who declared that Sheldon Sackett, Marshfield publisher, had visited the governor and urged him to curb terrorist activities only to be told by the governor that the situation was "too hot" to handle.
