

# Dorothy Lamour In Technicolor Romance Of South Seas At Craterian

## 'HER JUNGLE LOVE' PROVIDES THRILLS IN EXOTIC SETTING

An alluring and mysterious island in the South Seas, filmed for the first time in breath-taking Technicolor, forms the exotic background for "Her Jungle Love," starring Dorothy Lamour and Ray Milland at the New Craterian theatre, where it opens a three-day run today.

The picture tells the story of a handsome young aviator who is cast away on a deserted tropical island only to discover that its only other inhabitant is a lovely girl who has never before set eyes on a white man.

Miss Lamour, fresh from her success in "Hurricane," is shown as the native girl whose love for the young aviator runs afoul of a half-crazed native potentate, played by C. Carroll Naish, veteran of mysterious Oriental roles. She and Milland have to fight for their love, and later for their very lives, against furious native tribes who know white men only as "devils" come to take their island away from them. They escape only through the intercession of one of those miracles which make the South Pacific deserve its reputation for mystery and intrigue and amazing adventures.

The comedy of Lynne Overman relieves the tension and the romantic interest in his role of Milland's flying companion. Another member of the cast is Dorothy Howe, the Texas girl who suddenly found herself lifted from her telephone switchboard position to the enviable place of one of Hollywood's most promising newcomers.

A new Robert Benchley short, "How To Figure Out Your Income Tax," gives a humorous angle on the yearly headache. Also on the program is a colored cartoon and, of course, the latest news events as pictured through the lenses of the newsworld men.

## Machinery Tops In Spud Harvest

WASHINGTON, May 7.—(AP)—The works progress administration reported today the amount of labor required to raise the country's potato crop declined by about 45,000,000 man-hours during the last quarter century.

The report said there was less work in the potato field despite a slight rise in production and that the demand for labor would continue to decline as a result of the substitution of machinery for hand labor.

Further mechanization of production, especially in picking up and grading may be expected, the report said. At the same time, progressive breeding of disease-resistant varieties will make possible the elimination of part of the labor now needed to fight various blights, it added.

## WPA WORKERS IN OREGON INCREASE

WASHINGTON, May 7.—(AP)—Harry L. Hopkins, works progress administrator, told the house appropriations committee that employment on WPA projects increased from 1,448,855 last September 25, low point for the current fiscal year, to 2,530,255 on April 16.

His testimony before a subcommittee conducting hearings on the president's request for additional relief appropriations, made public today, included this partial table of employment and expenditures on WPA projects by states (employment as of Sept. 25, employment as of April 16, and total expenditures July 1, 1937, to March 31, 1938):
