COUNTY TO HAVE SPECIAL AIRMAIL PICK-UP SERVICE

Cars Will Collect Letters in Cities of Region for Official Plane Dispatch From Medford May 19th

Arrangements were completed today by Postmaster Frank DeSouza for a special Jackson pick-up service on Thursday, May 19 when an official plane will leave here to connect with Grants Pass, Roseburg, Cottage Grove and Portland as part of National Airmail Week observance.

The special pick-up service will give each locality of the county an opportunity to dispatch airmail on the authorized flight. Mr. DeSouza explained, the airmail thus picked up will be brought to Medford and dispatched on the special plane leaving the municipal airport at 10:30 a. m.

Medford and several other Jackson county cities will have special cachets for cancelling all outgoing airmail during National Airmail Week, May 15 to 21. Communities not having a special cachet may have their airmail cancelled with Medford's if they so desire, Mr. DeSouza stated.

Three Trips Planned The pick-up schedules were announced as follows: Trip 1—Leaves Ashland at 8:30 a. m. Trip 2—Leaves Prospect at 8 a. m. Trip 3—Leaves Rogue River at 8:30 a. m. Gold Hill 8:45 and Central Point 9:15.

Trip 4—Leaves Applegate at 8 a. m. Trip 8:30 and Jacksonville 9:00. Postal Employees Aid Other postoffices, such as Union Creek, Brownsville, Beigle and Colettin, may make arrangements to have their airmail conveyed to the nearest pick-up point for delivery to the special plane, Mr. DeSouza said.

Airmail in the outlying communities will be picked up by car. Drivers will be: Claude M. Houston, Otto W. DeJarnett, William S. Rose and Stanley G. Sherwood, all Medford postoffice employees.

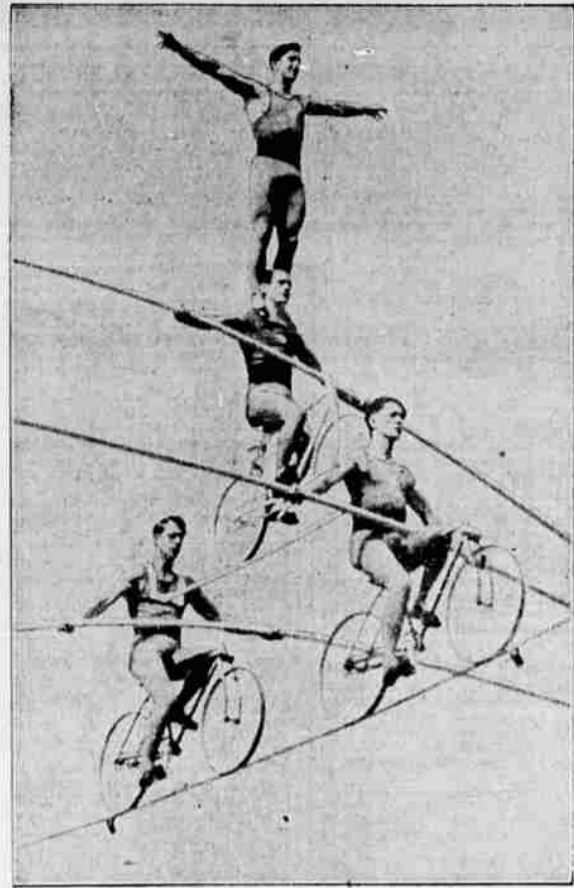
