NAB SPUD GROWER FOR LOAN MISUSE. PORTLAND, May 12—(AP)—Charles J. Hess, 24, potato grower living near Klamath Falls, was under arrest here today on a federal indictment charging that he obtained a \$400 loan from the farm credit administration in March, 1937, for seed and fertilizer but used it for other purposes. Hess told a reporter he used the money to "pick up some bills" on advice of a county board member of the PCA. As he paced the county jail, Hess in lieu of \$1000 bail, Hess expressed anxiety over his potatoes, which he was getting ready to plant. "I don't care so much for myself but I've got a wife and two boys, and we're expecting another in July," he remarked.

O. S. C. STUDENTS WILL VISIT TALENT STATION. CORVALLIS, May 12—(AP)—About 25 farm crops senior students will start next Friday on a thousand-mile annual field trip which will cover southern and southwestern Oregon points this year.
