

SPECIAL CACHETS PUBLICIZE VALLEY IN AIRMAIL WEEK

Citizens Are Asked to Help Advertise Area — Ceremony to Mark Departure of Plane Next Thursday

To be cancelled with Medford's special National Airmail Week cachet, airmail should not be deposited in the central postoffice before 10:57 Saturday night, it was stated today by Postmaster Frank DeSousa.

Regular airmail closes at 10:57 p. m. and anything deposited before that hour must be dispatched on the plane that departs 5 minutes later, Mr. DeSousa explained. Airmail deposited before that hour, however, will be held for dispatch Sunday under imprint of the special cachet provided that mail is so marked, he added. A notation "to hold" on the airmail is all that is required to have it held for cancellation by the special cachet, he related.

Jackson County Day
Airmail deposited after 10:57 p. m. Saturday and airmail deposited earlier but marked "hold" will be cancelled by the special cachet. Throughout National Airmail Week, May 15 to 21, inclusive, the special cachet will be used.

Jackson County Airmail Day
will be observed next Thursday. A special, officially authorized plane will leave Medford municipal airport at 10:30 a. m., taking airmail from the county and picking up additional airmail at Grants Pass, Roseburg and Cottage Grove for delivery in Portland and dispatched from there by regular commercial planes.

The special plane will be flown by Thomas A. Culbertson, Jr., president of the Medford chapter of the National Aeronautic association and member of the state board of aeronautics. Culbertson will be accompanied by A. H. Banwell, manager of the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce, as a good-will ambassador.

Ceremony Planned
Ceremonies will be held at each of the cities where the special plane will pick up airmail.

Mayor C. C. Furnas will officiate at the airport ceremony here. He will deliver the main speeches to Lorraine Young, six-year-old daughter of Postal Inspector and Mrs. Harold E. Young. The little girl, in turn, will hand the mail bags to Culbertson. The public is invited to the airport ceremony. Special automobiles, driven by postal employees, will converge on the airport from all parts of the county. The cars will pick up airmail from various communities throughout the county and deliver the sacks to the special plane. Several Jackson county communit-

ties have special cachets of their own and these will be used to cancel the airmail dispatched during National Airmail Week. As all the special cachets advertise the communities and the Rogue valley, Mr. DeSousa has called upon citizens to send as much airmail as possible during the week.

back to this country from his self-imposed exile in England. Lindbergh's plans were revealed in a letter to associates who helped him build in an old fish cannery here the "Spirit of St. Louis," the small, single-motored monoplane which carried the then gangling, happy-go-lucky former airmail and barnstorming pilot over the Atlantic ocean.

Return If Needed
The associates, who chose to remain unidentified, said the famous flyer wrote them he would remain in England with his wife, the former Anne Morrow, and his sons, Jon and

Land Morrow, born after the kidnapping and slaying of his first son in 1932, unless America needed him in event of war or other national emergency.

Lindbergh's letter quashed repeated reports heard since he left America secretly with his family in December, 1935, that he would renounce his American citizenship for that of Britain.

The glare of publicity turned upon the Lindberghs during the trial in New Jersey of Richard Bruno Hauptmann, later executed as the kidnap-

killer of their first born, was blamed for their leaving the country. **Avoids Publicity**
Lindbergh, who rose from an obscure aviator to a national figure in the short span of 33 1/2 hours which it took him to fly from Mineola, Long Island, after his takeoff May 20, 1927 to Le Bourget airdrome near Paris, has shunned publicity since he left America.

A few months ago, Lindbergh, who has continued his activity in aviation and science, made a surprise visit to America with his wife. He said "business" prompted the visit.

It was recently reported he purchased an island off the French coast on which to live in the quiet and seclusion he desires. **Tomorrow will mark the first birthday of Land Morrow Lindbergh, the Lindberghs' third son, born in England.**
