

PRIMARY ENTERS FINAL WEEK WITH ENNUI CONTINUING

Bourbon Gubernatorial Aspirants' Hope for New Deal Endorsement Furnishes Main Interest.

SALISBURY, May 13.—(AP)—Oregon's listless primary election campaign went into its last week today with both factions in the democratic gubernatorial campaign trying to obtain new deal endorsement.

There were rumors from Washington that the national administration would endorse Henry L. Hess of La Grande, labor candidate against Governor Martin.

Martin supporters displayed evidence which they hoped would prove that Roosevelt was friendly to Martin, the chief exhibit being a letter written March 22 by James A. Farley, democratic national chairman.

No Open Endorsement
But observers here thought the national administration would not support openly either faction, the feeling being that it would have much to lose and nothing to gain by doing so.

The report that Governor Martin had the state pay \$45 for his personal Christmas cards and \$250 for a plaque to be awarded each year to the winning reserve officers corps at Oregon State college and the University of Oregon was admitted by the governor, who said it was "state business."

A political advisor to the governor said that this charge was "fodder inspired by Republicans who want Hess nominated, because the Republicans think Hess would be easier to beat in the general election."

It was noted that Martin and State Treasurer Rufus C. Holman, Republican candidate for U. S. senator, endorsed the voucher for the cards, but Secretary of State Earl Snell, Republican candidate for re-nomination, did not do so. Snell said he couldn't remember, but he thought he was out of the city at the time the voucher was to be signed.

The voucher for the plaque did not have to be endorsed by anyone, since the funds came out of the governor's "special investigations" fund.

A week from today 521,235 voters will be eligible to nominate candidates for governor, U. S. senator, U. S. representative, state officers and the legislature but, outside of the democratic gubernatorial race, there has been little appeal to the voters.

Observers cannot remember a campaign as dull as the present one.

Those voters who will be out of town on election day already have cast their ballots, today being the last day for absentee voting.

Employees in 54 industries received good news this week when the state industrial accident commission reduced their industrial accident insurance rates by \$106,216 a year.

The commission, which pointed out that its \$7,000,000 fund is in a "healthy condition," has been reducing rates for the past three years, but this week's reduction was the largest.

Jefferson Stamps

On Sale In June

WASHINGTON, May 13.—(AP)—Two new three-cent stamps, one of them bearing a likeness of Thomas Jefferson, will go on sale next month. The Jefferson stamp, one of the new presidential series, will be sold here June 16. The other, commemorating the 300th anniversary of the landing of Sweden and France in Delaware, will go on sale first at Wilmington June 27. Both stamps are purple.

Two Feet Of Hail Within 15 Minutes

BELLEVILLE, Kas., May 13.—(AP)—Hail drifted two feet deep during a 15-minute storm here last night. It blocked entrances to business buildings and shattered many windows. The storm damaged much wheat near here. In Phillips county, thousands of acres of newly headed wheat was destroyed.

Ballstones as large as seven inches around were reported in Phillipsburg.

DOUGLAS GROUP PLANS CO-OP POWER DISTRICT

ROSEBURG, Ore., May 13.—(AP)—Tentative organization of the West Douglas Power co-operative resulted last night from a meeting at Tennille community hall. The proposed district would include the communities of Camas Valley, Tennille, Challa, Lockinglass, Reston and Engstrom, west and southwest of Roseburg.

The proposed electric line, which the district plans to construct through cooperation of the rural electrification administration, would extend along the route of the Roseburg-Copps bay highway for a distance of approximately 40 miles, serving 500 or more subscribers.

WEST SEEN SLATED FOR COMPTROLLER'S POST

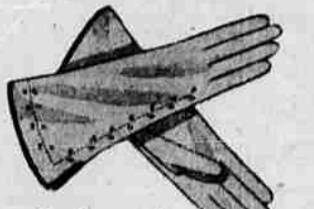

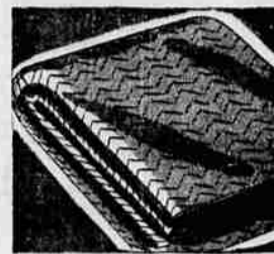

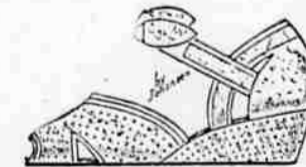
