

BACCALAUREATE SERVICE SUNDAY AT HIGH SCHOOL

Dr. Divine Will Deliver Sermon at Program Starting 8 P. M. — 207 Students on Graduating Lists

Dr. Sherman L. Divine, pastor of the First Presbyterian church, will give the sermon at the baccalaureate service for graduating Medford senior high school students Sunday night in the school auditorium.

Dr. Divine's sermon will be "The Voice Out of the Clouds." Invocation, prayer and benediction will be given by the Rev. James M. Hamilton, presiding minister and pastor of the First Christian church.

C. Glenn Smith, high school principal, said a tentative list revealed this year's graduating class to include 207 students, although the definite number wouldn't be known until next Thursday, when the complete list will be published.

Commencement exercises will be held May 27 at 8 p. m. in the auditorium. Because of the limited seating capacity of the auditorium, admission to the exercises will be by ticket only, Mr. Smith said. All graduating seniors will be given tickets for distribution to friends and relatives.

On Writing In

To the Editor: Will you please print the attached article which appeared in the Ashland Tidings of May 18? Thank you. H. S. DEUEL.

In the enthusiasm of last-minute political battles many things happen which are not reasonable, orthodox, or even fair.

In the current battle between Governor Martin and Henry L. Hess, for the Democratic gubernatorial nomination, the former apparently carrying the disapproval of leading Washington administration leaders and the latter apparently carrying the banner and approval of the same certain Washington administration leaders, such a situation has developed.

The extreme Martin-for-Governor enthusiasts are running wild, with the very unorthodox, meaningless and unnecessary appeal that Republicans write in the name of Governor Martin on the Republican ticket for governor.

In the first place voters must remember that Oregon has two political parties, Democratic and Republican, and that in the course of events Governor Martin affiliated with the Democratic party and is now seeking renomination on the Democratic ticket. An inter-party squabble has developed, which must and has to be settled by the Democrats.

It is true that Republicans can write in the name of Governor Martin on the Republican ticket as their choice for the Republican

nominee for governor, which the Martin-for-governor enthusiasts are asking Republicans to do, but Republicans must remember that the excellent candidates for the Republican gubernatorial nomination and that their writing in the name of Governor Martin on the Republican ticket is about as foolish and useless an act as one could conceive, for such votes cannot and are not counted in the Democratic contest and are absolutely useless unless Governor Martin should receive more votes on the Republican ticket than any of the many regular Republican candidates for this nomination.

Can you possibly conceive of Governor Martin's name being written in on the Republican ticket more times than that of Arthur Sprague, for instance, regular Republican candidate, and apparently the leading candidate for the Republican gubernatorial nomination?

Of course you cannot conceive of such an outcome, so why waste your vote in the primary, Republican voters!

Do not be misled by this propaganda. Republican voters, and thereby lose the effectiveness of your franchise right to choose your party nominee. Vote for your choice among the regular Republican candidates for the primary nomination for governor. This applies also to Democrats in exercising their franchise to select their own party nominee.

Then this fall, Mr. and Mrs. Republican, when you have a right to vote, with the knowledge that your vote will actually count for any gubernatorial candidate, whether Democratic or Republican, with the chance of having your vote actually amount to something, vote for either Democrat or Republican nominee, as your conscience dictates.

The Daily Tidings does not hesitate one moment to suggest and advise, as it did in this column Tuesday, that Democrats should by all means support Governor Martin for the Democratic nomination for governor in order to defeat the effort of Washington political leaders to control and dictate Oregon government and politics.

TELEPHONE COMPANY DECORATES PAIR FOR CANYON CITY HEROISM

SAN FRANCISCO, May 19.—(AP)—Devotion to duty in the face of a sweeping fire at Canyon City, Ore., a year ago won bronze wall medals for two Canyon City employees of the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company today.

The company's award committee announced Hilda Valade, operator, and Sanders L. Overstreet, manager, would receive honors commemorating ideals promulgated by Theodore N. Vail as Bell system chief.

Mrs. Valade was credited with calling aid from other towns, with rescuing hazards to life by warning against fallen power lines, and with staying at her post until flames broke through the windows of her office.

Overstreet, the committee said acted as a volunteer fireman, and after his switchboard was burned climbed a nearby pole and maintained communication with other cities, which resulted in new telephone equipment arriving from Portland the next morning.
