

NATIONAL HEALTH SECRETARY WILL BE VISITOR HERE

Dr. Reginald Atwater of New York City, executive secretary of the American Public Health association, will

pay Medford a visit next month. It was announced today by Miss Mildred Carlton, president of the Jackson County Public Health association. Dr. Atwater is coming to the coast to attend the annual convention of the western division of the health association in Portland June 8-9. Whether he will visit Medford on his way to or from the Portland meeting had not been ascertained, but arrangements were being made for him to address a gathering of health workers here. Dr. Atwater once taught public health at Yale university in China and is considered an authority on the

subject. Because of his comprehensive insight into public health problems the world over, his talk here will be of especial value to the community. Miss Carlton pointed out. Miss Carlton and Mrs. Blanche Runels Friable, supervisor of county nurses, met and heard Dr. Atwater at a public health convention in Helena, Mont., a few years ago and they urged all public health workers to attend his meeting here. A delegation from Jackson county will attend the Portland meeting. Miss Carlton said.

The Medford elementary schools will present 500 children in a music festival tonight at the senior high

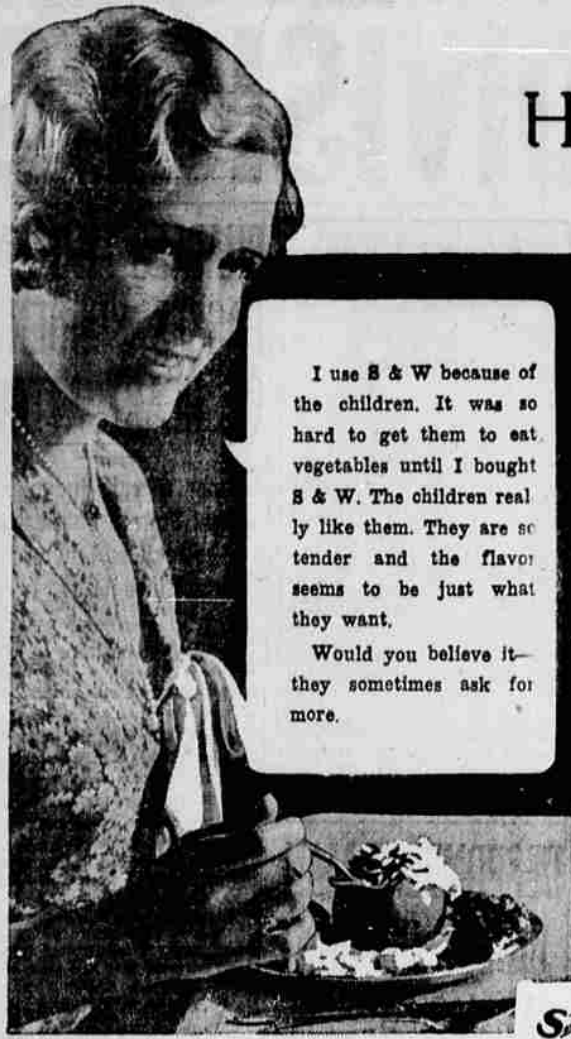
