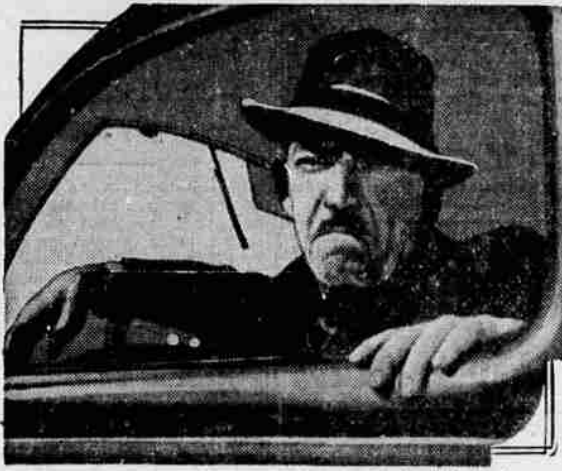

FUGITIVE UNION HEAD IS HELD IN SEATTLE

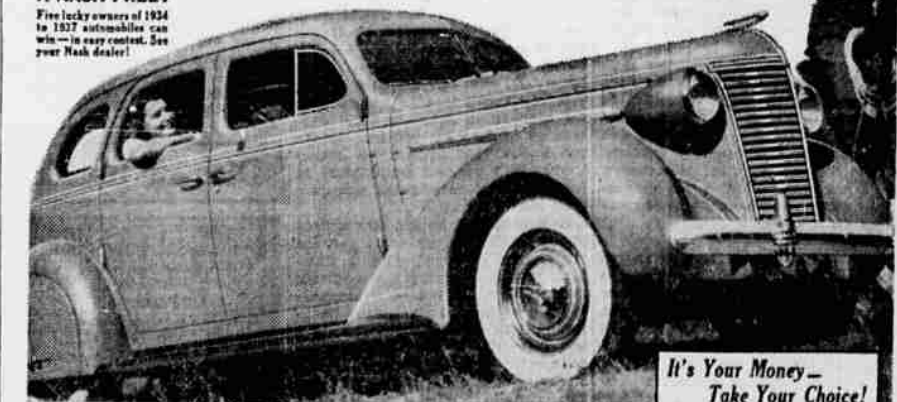

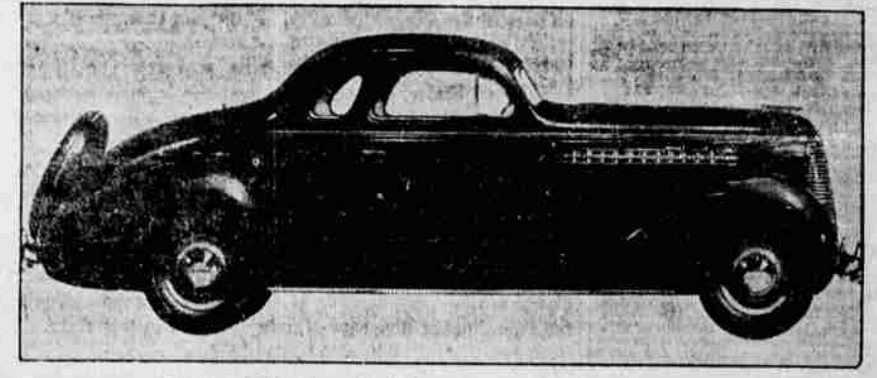

PERKINS REMOVAL URGED BY LEGION

COTTAGE GROVE, May 21.—(AP)—A resolution adopted by the Williamson Valley council of the American Legion posts urged President Roosevelt to immediately remove Frances Perkins as secretary of labor, and accused the secretary of an "un-American" attitude in affairs of the department.

The resolution said, in part: "Whereas * * * Madame Perkins has refused to enforce the immigration laws, and * * * has reversed the order of her predecessor requiring the fingerprinting of all immigrants * * * thereby permitting the entry of criminal aliens * * * and has repeatedly shown an un-American attitude in her dealings with matters brought to the attention of the department of labor * * * and whereas her actions as herein enumerated have contributed in no small way to the general unrest and financial depression * * * (we) do urgently request (the president) to forthwith remove the said Frances Perkins from the office of secretary of labor."

CENTRAL POINT VOTES WATER IMPROVEMENT

CENTRAL POINT, May 21.—(Sp.)—Proposed improvement in Central Point's water supply was favored over three to one in Friday's election. The two Central Point precincts gave a total of 163 for sale of water bonds to finance the project, while 81 voted in the negative. The vote by precincts was: North precinct: yes, 83; no, 30; South precinct: yes, 80; no, 21.

HUNDRED RESCUED FROM FLAMES IN SAN FRAN HOTEL

SAN FRANCISCO, May 21.—(AP)—One hundred persons were rescued and seven slightly hurt in a \$25,000 fire that flared up the elevator shaft of a five-story apartment hotel here today.

Scores were helped down ladders or carried downstairs when smoke and flames trapped scantily clad guests. Charles Tennant, 68, suffered a heart attack in the excitement and was carried out. He recovered. Mr. and Mrs. George English, 38 and 40 respectively, fled down the steps with sheets over their heads. They were sent to a hospital suffering from cuts and smoke inhalation. James Bailey, 18, overcome by smoke, was treated at the scene.

Three firemen were treated at Central Emergency hospital. Charles Flynn, 43, and Charles Egan, 41, suffered lacerations, and Ralph Halvorson, 26, received painful injury when a burning chip lodged in his eye. Several months ago a similar fire, also starting at the base of the elevator shaft, periled the structure. It has rooms for about 200.

Bend Paper Given Permit For Radio

WASHINGTON, May 20.—(AP)—The Bend, Ore., bulletin authorized yesterday by the communications commission to establish a new radio station to be operated on 1310 kilocycles, with power of 100 watts night and 250 watts day. An application by Elwood Warwick Lippincott, Inc., which also sought to establish a new station at Bend, was denied.
