NEW YORK FAIR FUND NOT FOR 'FRISCO USE
SALEM, May 25-(AP)-O'gon's world's fair commission suffered a setback today when Attorney-General J. H. Van Winkle ruled that the \$300,000 appropriated by the 1937 legislature for the New York fair cannot be spent on the state's exhibit at the San Francisco World's Fair.

Both fairs will be held next year. Oregon withdrew a month ago from the New York fair when the state's exhibit site was given to France, fair officials offering another site to Oregon. The commission, asserting it would concentrate on the San Francisco fair, asked the attorney-general if it would be legal to use the New York fair funds at the San Francisco fair.

ALLAN HART TAKES ANTI-TRUST DUTIES
PORTLAND, May 25-(AP)-Allan Hart, deputy United States district attorney, resigned yesterday to become a special assistant in the anti-trust department of the United States department of justice at Washington, D. C. He will take over his new duties June 15. District Attorney Carl Douglas said.

Cardozo 68
WASHINGTON, May 25-(AP)-Justice Benjamin Nathan Cardozo, who has been absent from the supreme court because of illness since December 10, became 68 today. His birthday anniversary was spent quietly at Port Chester, N. Y., where he is recuperating from heart disease. His friends hope he will be able to return to the bench next October when the fall term starts.

TIBET LAMA'S JEWELS RECOVERED IN CHINA
SHANGHAI, May 25 (AP)-A valuable cache of the late Panchen Lama's jewels and other valuables has been recovered from two Tibetans arrested in the French concession here.

Police suspected them of stealing the valuables from the lama's body while it was being carried into Tibet last March. The Tibetans were described as former servants of the Panchen Lama, one of the two principal rulers of Tibet.
