GUARDSMEN TO HOLD WEEK-END MANEUVERS AS CAMP PREPARATION

Company A, 18th Infantry of the Oregon national guard will hold a holiday week-end bivouac on the Hughes property in the Coleman creek area about three miles west of Phoenix. The maneuvers are in preparation for the annual national guard encampment at Camp Clatsop in June.

Camp will be established Saturday night, the guardsmen sleeping in shelter tents and eating out of mess kits during the bivouac. The schedule for the first full day, beginning at 8 a. m. Sunday, includes scouting, patrolling, extended order exercises, individual firing at silhouette targets at unknown ranges and night problems in patrolling and establishing outposts.

Second day will be devoted entirely to musketry. This involves team work in controlling the fire of small units in assumed combat problems. Signs will be posted from Phoenix to the camp area to direct those who wish to visit the camp and witness the firing problems.

The maneuvers will be in charge of Capt. Carl Y. Tengwald, company commander. He will be assisted by 1st Lieut. Weldon H. McEee and 2nd Lieut. Bruce W. Moffatt, platoon commanders.

NEW YORK, May 26.—(AP) Stocks were unsuccessul in maintaining a mild rally today and market leaders succumbed to an afternoon sell-off for losses running to 3 or more points.

A sharp break in several commodities, especially cotton futures, cast further clouds on speculative sentiment for stocks, but cotton came back a little from the worst. In addition, trading forces were inclined to lighten commitments when word was received the president would announce in a broadcast tomorrow after the close his action on the tax revision bill. The measure has been awaiting the executive's signature or veto for some days.

While tension over the German-Czech crisis seemed to have eased a trifle, Wall street recognized Europe is not out of the woods so far as war is concerned and there was a disinclination of commission house customers to climb on a buying list pending more assurances of peace on the continent.

Activity broadened on the retreat, with transfers approximating 700,000 shares.
