BONNEVILLE CREATES HUGE RAILROAD JOB
HOOD RIVER, May 27.—(AP)—The Union Pacific railway company announced today it would employ about 300 laborers and 50 engineers and skilled workers for approximately two years to raise the tracks between Cascade Locks and The Dalles. The \$1,500,000 project will route

the roadbed around the Columbia river high water level created by the construction of Bonneville dam.
