

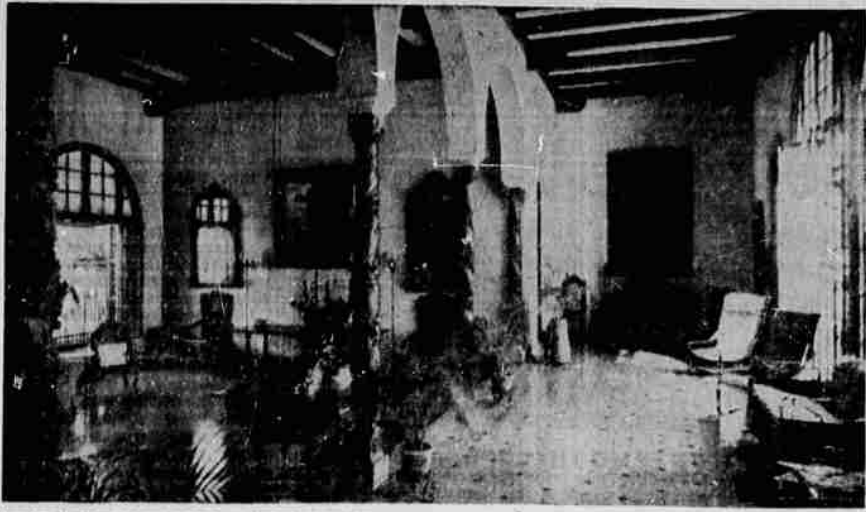
REMODELED ROXY ANN FOUNTAIN TO OPEN WEDNESDAY

New Front and Fixtures in Remodelling Program—Lunches and Fountain Service Are Featured

The Roxy Ann, popular Medford confectionery which has been closed for remodeling since May 8, will be presented to the people of Medford and southern Oregon Wednesday in new, modern dress. With a smartly designed interior, ultra-modern tile front and fixtures of the latest type, the Roxy Ann is one of southern Oregon's most attractive establishments. W. O. Webster and R. W. Webster, well known Medford business men, are owners of the firm and their comprehensive remodeling program is their expression of faith in the future of this city, according to statements issued today.

A new "Liquid Detroit" soda fountain has been installed in the confectionery, one of the most modern fountains on the market today and is built of stainless steel and through an ingenious arrangement of refrigerating coils, all the syrups used in making sodas and sundaes are kept at constant low temperatures, assuring patrons cold drinks. The new fountain also contains compartments to keep ice cream at the proper temperature for serving at all times.

A complete new counter in the shape of a double bay trimmed with a solid blue top and stainless steel and new chairs upholstered in leather and trimmed with chrome have been installed. The interior is finished in Lamsa wood as are the booths that have been added. A basement has been added which will serve as the kitchen and ice cream room. A new type ice cream container known as a "tray-serve" will be used by the confectionery. The new container is built to fit the freezing compartment of home refrigerators so that ice cream may be kept on hand for use at anytime. In addition to regular fountain and lunch service, a special plate luncheon will be featured in the new Roxy Ann.

F. D. R. SILENT ON HOPKINS' ACTION

WASHINGTON, May 31.—(AP)—President Roosevelt declined today to say "yes" or "no" to the question of whether he was consulted beforehand on Harry Hopkins' statement endorsing a candidate for the Democratic senatorial nomination in Iowa.

Hopkins told newsmen last week if he were citizen of Iowa he would vote for Representative Wearin in preference to Senator Gillette.

The president said that if he answered the question yes it would be interpreted as favoring one candidate. If he answered no, he said it would be interpreted to the advantage of the other candidate. In future, he added, he would not answer such questions either from candidates or the press.

Asked whether he was supporting one of Iowa candidates over the other he replied that he was taking the position he had taken in previous primaries and refused to amplify that statement.

Congratulate Pope On 81st Birthday

CARTEL GANDOLFO, May 31.—(AP)—Letters, telegrams and flowers poured into Pope Pius' summer villa today, congratulating him upon his 81st birthday.

Among the messages was one from Eugenio Cardinal Pacelli, papal secretary of state, on behalf of the papal delegation to the eucharistic congress at Budapest. In Cardinal Pacelli's absence, Monsignor Domenico Tardini, his assistant, read the messages to the pope.

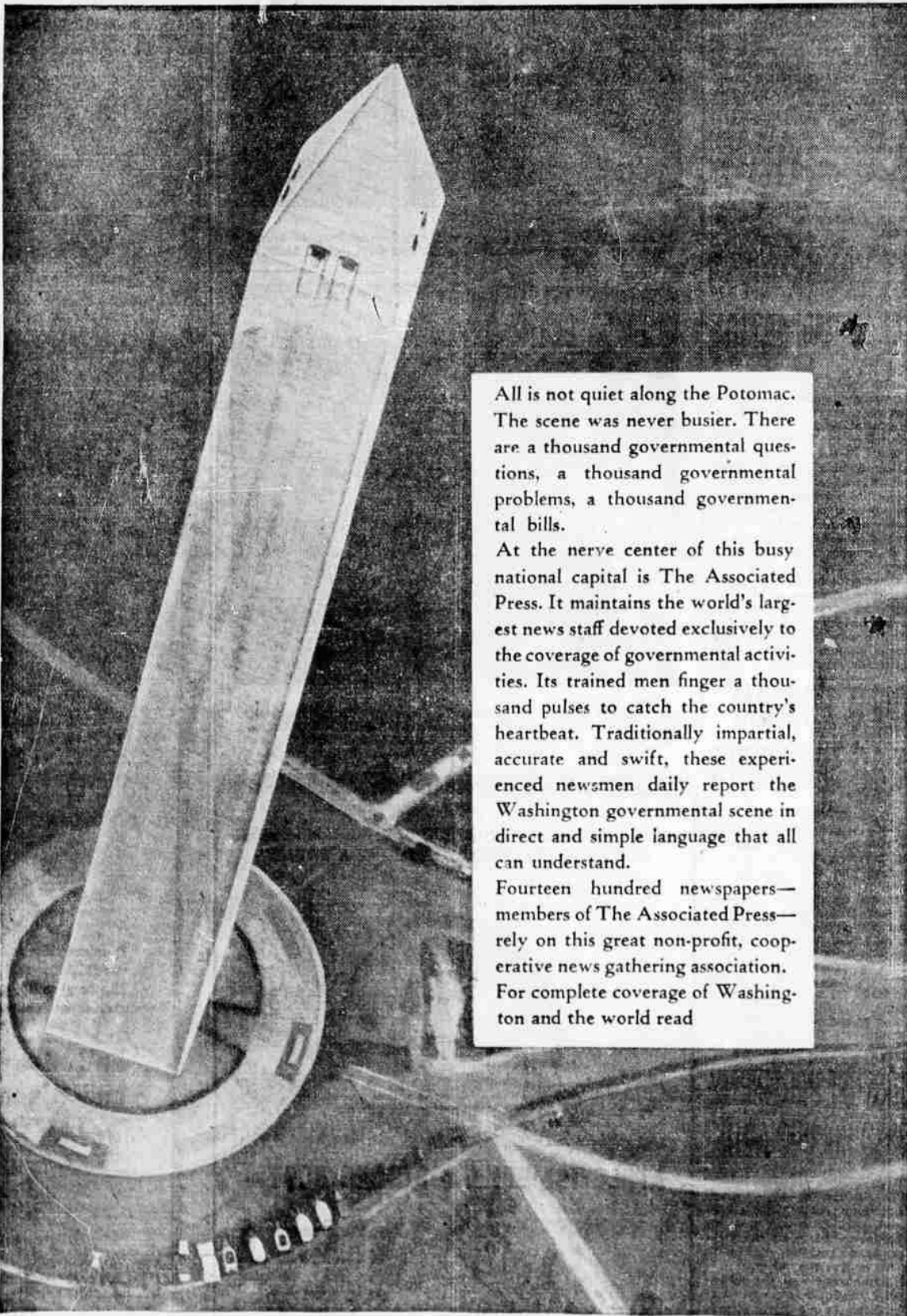
