

### \$100 AND 30 DAYS FOR FARM HAND ON DRUNK DRIVE COUNT

A Justice court jury returned a verdict yesterday afternoon finding La Vert Twitcheil, 26, farmhand, guilty of driving an auto while under the influence of intoxicating liquor. The jury deliberated ten minutes.

Twitcheil was sentenced to 30 days in the county jail, fined \$100 and his driver's license was suspended for one year.

Another Justice court jury yesterday returned a verdict of not guilty in favor of Louie Thorsom, charged with petty larceny. The action involved portions of a well-drilling outfit.

Albert A. Rogers and Wayne Olson, recent arrivals from Klamath Falls, charged with attempting to rob a rooming house, were each sentenced to 60 days in jail on a vagrancy charge. The court rejected their plea to be allowed to go to California, where they claimed they had employment.

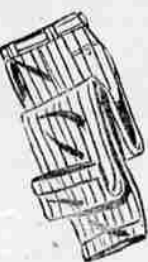

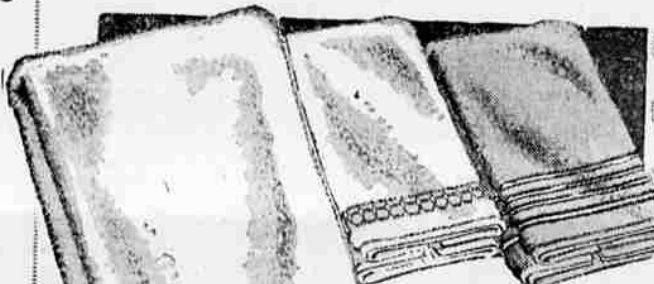
