

Gracie Allen, George Burns In "College Swing" On Craterian Program

MARTHA RAYE TOPS SUPPORTING STARS SPARKLING COMEDY

Gracie Allen, George Burns and Martha Raye, who panicked audiences in "College Holiday," head the all-star cast of the new musical comedy, "College Swing," which opens a three day run at the new air-cooled Craterian theatre today.

In this story of a collegiate nitwit who takes over a leading American university and runs it to suit herself, the three gay clowns are assisted in their antics by Bob Hope, who climbed into the top drawer of stardom by virtue of his single performance as the master of ceremonies in the recent "Big Broadcast of 1938."

The story of "College Swing" is the high-geared fantasy which has always provided Burns and Allen with their most successful material. It opens in Puritan times with a wealthy old New Englander making a will bequeathing the college he has founded to the first female member of his family who passes an examination in it. The camera then slides on down two centuries and shows Gracie, his descendant, getting herself in shape for the big test.

With the aid of a resourceful young student, Bob Hope, Gracie discovers a short-cut to knowledge which would make Einstein look like a piker. She passes the examinations with flying colors and takes control of the university immediately.

Under Gracie's regime, an educational revolution takes place. "Liberal education" is made "liberal" in every sense of the word, with Gracie as "Dean of Men."

Martha Raye as a member of the faculty and Hope as "Professor of Applied Romance." He "applies" it to all of the people, Martha, thus focusing the screen's newest love team.

Other members of the hilarious cast include Edward Everett Horton, Ben Blue, Betty Grable, Jackie Coogan and Skinny Ennis.

Jeanette MacDonald and Nelson Eddy In Operetta At Rialto

Drama, romance, thrills and the gorgeous music of Victor Herbert's greatest operetta are blended in "Naughty Marietta," spectacular romance of Crole's days in New Orleans, which opens a three-day engagement today at the Rialto theatre. Directed by W. S. The dramatic side of the period is stressed as a thundering background for the glamorous music of Victor Herbert.

Such song hits as "Ah, Sweet Mystery of Life," "I'm Falling in Love With Someone," "The Italian Street Song" and all the original songs and lyrics of the operetta are sung by the two stars.

Other members of the cast include Frank Morgan, Akim Tamiroff, Douglas Dumbrille and ten thousand extras as American Indians and settlers of early New Orleans.

"Walking Down Broadway" a smart, snappy first run feature starring Claire Trevor, Michael Whalen, Dixie Dunbar and a dozen others, plays as the companion feature with the return hit.
