

OFFICIAL COUNT GIVEN IN STATE PRIMARY BALLOT

Hess Defeated Martin 59,620 to 52,642 for Democratic Gubernatorial Nomination, Is Final Word

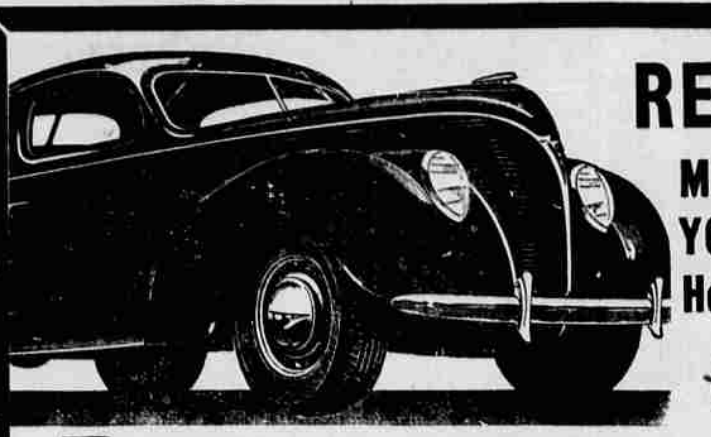
SALEM, June 9.—(AP)—Henry L. Hess defeated Gov. Charles H. Martin for the Democratic to 59,620, the official election canvass showed today. O. Henry Olen received 8,200 votes, while Governor Martin's name was written in for the Republican nomination 3,780 times. Results of the Republican gubernatorial race were: Charles A. Sprague 62,275, Sam H. Brown 24,025, Henry M. Hansen 6,153, R. J. Hendricks 2,871, J. W. Morrison 5,702, Charles L. Palmer 9,882, M. S. Shrock 3,881, and Clarence R. Wagoner 12,056. Holman Far Ahead. Rufus C. Holman, state treasurer, received 94,522 votes for the Republican nomination for U. S. senator, to 36,658 for Robert N. Stanfield. Results of the Republican race for U. S. senator (short term) were Alex G. Barry 45,996, T. McNary Weed 40,778, and Reade M. Ireland 32,979. Willis Mahoney, who won the Democratic nomination for U. S. senator, received 74,616 votes to 38,750 for U. S. Dist. Attorney Carl C. Donoghue. Robert A. Miller, unopposed for U. S. senator (short term), received 71,875 votes. Results of the Democratic congressional race: First district—Andrew C. Burk, 19,881, W. T. Miller 10,012, Earl A. Nott 13,950. Second district—Walter M. Pierce 14,228, Wade Crawford 5,373. Third district—Nan Wood Honneman 30,739, William J. Prendergast, Jr., 7,983, Jack Wagner 6,223. G. O. P. Races. Results of Republican congressional races: First district—James W. Mott 53,797, Walter Norblad 14,196. Second district—U. S. Valentine 8,289, Bayard T. Merrill 5,103, Renzie A. Tull 4,442. Third district—Homer D. Angell 27,062, Walter L. Tooze 17,031. Secretary of State Earl Snell, unopposed for the Republican nomination, received 127,116 votes, while Emily F. Edson, Democrat, who will oppose him in November, received 81,805 votes. She also was unopposed. Charles A. Rice, unopposed for the Republican nomination for state superintendent of public instruction, received 104,869 votes. Labor Commissioner C. H. Gram had 76,857 for the Republican nomination, compared with 42,752 for David F. Graham. Rex Putnam, state superintendent of public instruction, defeated John W. Leonard 55,280 to 42,408 for the Democratic nomination. Clarence F. Hyde defeated Paul E. Roth 52,377 to 44,712 for the Democratic nomination for labor commissioner. Supreme Court Justice Hall S. Luak was re-elected, receiving 123,548 votes to 86,144 for Attorney-General I. H.

DETERMINISM AND BELIEF POSSIBLE

SAN FRANCISCO, June 9.—(AP)—Belief in God and "determinism" of Freud were declared compatible today at the American Psychiatric Association by Clarence O. Cheney, M. D., of New York City. Freud's "determinism" was explained by Dr. A. A. Brill of New York City, one of the foremost Freudians, as permitting a certain degree of use of free will. Determinism means, Dr. Brill explained, that although human acts are due to causes largely outside the control of an individual, a person cannot escape responsibility because his will, or freedom of choice, also is a factor. "Determinism," said Dr. Cheney, "is not necessarily incompatible with belief in God. One can say that God is responsible for things in the beginning, and regard Him as primarily a symbol of some power whose manifestations we can see, but cannot define."
