

ROAD COMMISSION FINDS C OF C MEN HARD TO SATISFY

Always Seeking More Expenditure in Their Localities — Southern Oregon Meeting Cited As Case

By PAUL W. HARVEY, Jr. SALEM, June 10.—(AP)—Chambers of commerce members are about the hardest people to satisfy, the state highway commission believes.

No matter how much money the commission spends in a certain region, the region's chamber will cry for more, complaining that the commission has forgotten them. Last week the commission went to Medford to hear southern Oregon chambers complain of the condition of the Pacific highway north of Grants Pass. The chamber accused the commission of planning to divert traffic from California over the Willamette and The Dalles-California highways instead of the Pacific highway.

They also charged that the commission hasn't spent enough money on the Pacific highway in southern Oregon, although the department is spending \$2,000,000 on the Siskiyou grade.

Chairman Explains
But after Chairman H. F. Cabell of the commission pointed out that southern Oregon has received as much money as any other section, the chamber appeared satisfied. Cabell also pointed out that the commission doesn't have all the money in the world to spend.

The commission spent \$10,000,000 last year, its revenues coming from \$4,500,000 in federal funds, \$9,780,000 from the gasoline tax and \$2,908,000 from motor vehicle license fees.

But all of that money did not go into new construction. Nineteen per cent went for interest and maturities on bonds, 16 per cent for maintenance, and 10 per cent to counties. Administration cost was only 1.92 per cent.

Some department engineers don't feel any too kindly toward chambers of commerce, the maintenance department might now have a grudge against the secretary of one chamber who told the department that there was very little snow in the MacKenzie pass. The maintenance engineer, on the basis of the secretary's estimate, figured it would cost \$50 to remove the snow.

However, when department snowplows arrived at the pass, they found it would cost \$1500. The zealous secretary cost the department \$1450.

\$264,020,000 Spent
From 1917 through 1937 the department has spent \$264,020,000, the state giving \$203,497,000, the federal government \$49,978,000 and counties \$10,545,000. Of the total, \$141,000,000 went for new construction, Douglas county having the most work done (\$11,000,000 worth).

Lane county was next on the list with \$8,900,000. Other counties getting road work improvements of more than \$5,000,000 were Clatsop, Clackamas, Coos, Jackson, Klamath, Lincoln, Multnomah, Umatilla and Wasco.

By highways, the Pacific highway has had the largest amount spent on it, \$90,600,000. The Oregon Coast highway with \$23,000,000 was second, while the Columbia River highway was third with \$14,138,000.

It cost \$36,000,000 to maintain the state's 31 highways during the 20 years.

Californians have been doing their part to help Oregon have a banner tourist year, predicted by the state highway department.

Of the 31,797 cars which came into the state during the first five months this year, 14,671 were from California, and 6880 from Washington.

There have been cars from every state, the District of Columbia, Alaska, Hawaii, Canal Zone, Philippines, Cuba, China, Mexico, Malay States and Canada.

The total number of cars to enter the state so far this year is about 1000 more than for the same period last year.

Registration books will be open until October 8, a month before the general election.

Republicans now lead 285,132 to 248,169, which was the record primary registration. The state election department expects the general election record to go by the boards.
