

PWA ANNIVERSARY COMES ON EVE OF HEAVY SPENDING

Program Expected Create \$1,866,000,000 During Next Two Years—Most To Non-Federal Work.

WASHINGTON, June 17.—(AP)—The Public Works administration celebrated its fifth anniversary today with a fanfare of excited preparation for its new billion-dollar program.

As soon as President Roosevelt signs the lending-spending bill, which includes a \$965,000,000 allotment of PWA, the depression-born agency will begin assigning money to individual projects.

States and municipalities will pay part of the cost, so that the program is expected to create \$1,866,000,000 of spending during the next two years. All but \$200,000,000 will go to non-federal projects.

Work Reviewed. Construction in the last five years totaled \$1,445,000,000 for non-federal works. PWA announced in an anniversary review. The old programs resulted in 15,992 federal and 10,543 non-federal projects costing \$4,339,387,794.

The first new non-federal projects authorities said, will be preponderantly schools, waterworks and sewers. All states will share in the initial allotments, which are scheduled to approximate 600 a day until 2,000 holdover projects have been approved.

This backlog of applications from the old programs will be followed at once by allotments to new applicants. Since announcing the 1938 program, PWA has received almost 100 applications from the field offices.

The latter reported another 600 in the mill, with indications that a total of 4,000 may be reached. Informed persons said, however, that many of these would fall by the wayside.

Set Filing Deadline. No project may be authorized unless the application is filed before September 30, 1938, unless construction can begin before January 1, 1939, and unless work can be finished by June 30, 1940.

Federal allotments may not be made until local funds are forthcoming. Heretofore, many applicants have received earmarking for 45 per cent of construction cost and then delayed or failed entirely to provide their 55 per cent. In evidence, 1,405 projects under old programs remain to be finished.

Similarly, applicants often have encountered months of delay over specifications and contracts. Congress and the president intended the 1938 program for agencies who were ready to spend. They gave PWA no discretion to waive the limits, and that fact alone may change the whole character of public works.

CLERGY PROTEST SUNDAY OPENING OF FOOD STORES

The Medford Ministerial association at a meeting yesterday adopted a resolution protesting the opening of grocery stores on Sunday.

It was voted to send a copy of the resolution to each retail food store in Medford and vicinity and to every minister to be read from the pulpit at church services Sunday.

The resolution, signed for the association by Dr. Sherman L. Divine, president, follows:

"The Medford Ministerial association in a special meeting today, June 16, having been informed of the intention of certain grocery and food stores to open their places of business on Sunday, unanimously voted to protest such action as subversive to the public weal and in defiance of well-established and universally recognized moral and religious custom."

"We believe such action unwarranted and unjustified. We urge all store owners in the city of Medford and vicinity to strictly observe the spirit and the letter of the observance of Sunday as a day of rest and worship, for both themselves and their employes, and we urge all our citizens and especially all members of religious organizations to confine the purchase of household necessities to the six-day period and to use their influence to discourage any and all violations of the well-recognized and honored American custom, handed down from our earliest founders, of keeping the Lord's Day."

The following churches are represented in the association by their pastors: First Baptist, the Rev. Wolford Dawes; First Christian, the Rev. James Hamilton; First Methodist, the Rev.
