Dealing dragged in comparison with the speedy performance of last week. At that, periods of activity generally found leaders pushing upward. Transfers were around 12,000,000 shares. Sentiment was chilled a bit by action of Santa Fe directors in again deferring consideration of interest on the company's 4 per cent adjustment bonds and omitting the semi-annual dividend on the preferred due at this time. Both the common and preferred issues took a downward course after holding fairly well for a time after the directors had voted. The bonds in question were resistant.
